Railways and Religion – a new angle on our local history



*The work was hard, and the work was tough,
They had mud in their boots and their hands were rough...*
The Ballad of the Ravenstonedale Navvy

'Railways & Religion in the Western Dales' is an innovative new trail focussing on the strong links between the historic development of both the railways and local churches and chapels, who provided spiritual and practical support to the thousands of navvies working on the railway lines. Often in appalling weather, with poor living conditions and exposed to constant and life-threatening dangers, these men toiled on the tracks, with their wives and children often sharing their shanties.

At the launch of the new leaflet on 13th October at Tebay Methodist Church, the children of Ravenstonedale School performed a choral ballad they had written with the help of local vicar, the Revd Beverley Lock, 'The Ballad of the Ravenstonedale Navvy'. The children of Tebay School acted out the navvy life and two of the older girls gave a beautiful rendition of Mollie Malone.

The event was attended by the Archdeacon of Carlisle, the Venerable Kevin Roberts as master of ceremonies and a participatory train game was led by the Revd Richard Teal, Chair of the Cumbria Methodist District.

Bernard Thornborrow, church steward at Tebay Methodist Church said
"It was the coming of the railways to Tebay which caused the churches and chapels to expand in this area. The increasing number of employees building the railways really shaped the life of the church. This trail tells this interesting aspect of our local history".

Gina Dowding, of the Churches Trust for Cumbria who funded the leaflet said
"This is an exciting new addition to attract visitors to new places to Tebay Ravenstonedale and Crosby Garrett. In all, the trail highlights a dozen small, simple and serene chapels, churches and meeting houses together with a map of their locations and a short piece on the history of the 'break-away' churches from the mid seventeenth century

Councillor Joan Raine, chair of Eden District Council said at the event
"Trains played a big part in our household when my children were young from stories about Thomas the Tank Engine to visits to transport museums. This trail brings together another story about the railways and is an excellent new addition for tourists in the area".

Thoughts from High Westmorland

What is your core business?

Sounds like the opening gambit for a Management talk doesn't it? Actually it is rather more important than that.

It's a bit of a self audit that I was thinking about.

What is my, what is your, core business?

What are we about?

Personally?

In our relationships?

In our work?

At leisure?

As we walk or drive to the paper shop?

What really matters to us?

When everything else is stripped away what really fires us up?

It may seem obvious to you but then again it may not be so clear today as it once was. Often we are so busy that we lose sight of what is most important to us. However it helps to be clear otherwise we get side tracked and end up wasting our effort and our resources, very busy but not actually achieve that satisfying thing that we are so passionate about. Knowing what our core business is provides us with a measuring stick against which we can check that a course of action or activity fits in with where we want to be or who we want to be.

There is much banter in our house between those who have the more traditionally masculine trait of being very single-minded, focused and the traditionally more feminine trait of multi-tasking. However that is not really what I am referring to either. Focused or

multi-tasking is about how we travel along the road. 'Core Business' is more basic than that; it's where we are passionate about arriving.

Jesus in the Gospels is a man who is totally clear about his core business. As a child of twelve, when his parents question him about what he has been doing, he tells them that he has been "about my father's business". His father God's business seems to be to show the world how God would have human beings to live by living a truly good life. He offers those around him an alternative to the distractions and selfish ways they had been following. He does it in various ways; by telling stories, by healing and reassuring the sick and by challenging those in power. However he is always aiming towards a clear goal, to show people a different way to live; God's way; the way of love.

Whether we take our inspiration from the Christian story or not the example of Jesus in this clarity of purpose can give us all food for thought. Can you put into a sentence the answer to the question – "What is your core business"? It could change your life – ask a Christian.

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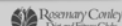

Notes from the Herald, November 1911

Stormy and colder. The fine weather of October broke on 29th then gale, deluge, floods. The following Sunday an even stronger gale and raid and wind for the rest of the month.

Orton's Mrs. Mary Gibson, 92 of Petty Hall, widow of Mr. Robert Gibson, died on Saturday 11th. She had been bedfast since 1901 looked after by her daughter Mrs. William Richardson. Four Tebay farmers were had up for letter their ponies stray on an Orton road on Nov 9th. Fined one shilling each as the Bench sympathised. David Robinson, Orton shoemaker, up for poaching on Dr. Gibson's land on 25th September. The keeper Robert Brindle and the underkeeper James Bowness both of Orton, saw him at 5.30a.m. Defendant denied it then and in court. Fined £1 and £1 costs. The Primitive Methodists' Missionary sermons on Sunday 26th in Orton and Tebay Chapels.

Tebay Railwaymen's Union weekend 28-29th October. The Chief Clerk of the T.Loco Dept. Mr. G.W. Farnworth was promoted to Chester. Has been a stalwart of Tebay Cricket, Football, Church and C.E. Men's Society. His successor is Mr. T.B. Crome of Tebay. The Lune salmon fishing at Tebay not good. Tebay's new Infant School will be for 70 pupils says London. Tebay Temperance Brass Band had concert, supper and dance in the Market Hall on Monday 20th. It was crowded.

Langdale School needs a female uncertificated assistant teacher.

Ravenstonedale had the Ullswater Foxhounds at start of November; kept them busy. Also there then for two weeks was Newton Rigg's Travelling Dairy Van; 13 took the course and exam at the end. On Tuesday 14th, the Congregational Church's Library Soiree, an annual event, was hit by storms - few came. On the evening of 15th the Band of Hope's concert in the Public Room was full.

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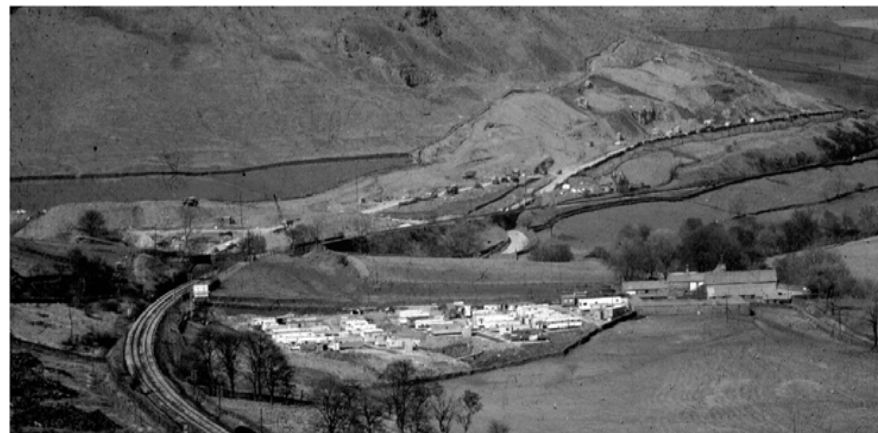
