Thoughts from High Westmorland

“Macbeth - the High School
Musical”

Sound a bit strange?

Well it certainly was different.

The three witches were High
School bullies, well two were,
and third was a glove puppet! (it
was a very small cast)

Duncan - the King in
Shakespeare's original play -
became the Head Boy and
Macbeth plotted to take over his
place. It was played for laughs
and very well done. It made the
16th century text come alive for a
modern audience and made much
more sense to them in this
modern setting. The cultural
references, albeit American rather
than British, the talk of mobile
phones and bike sheds, we could
all understand without recourse to
foot notes or a study guide. A
group of school age youngsters
were sitting along from me and,
although not your usual audience
for Shakespeare, were really
enjoying it. They were laughing
at it and following its story in the
same way that the original
Elizabethan audience would have
done.

I know that some people feel that
this is not the way that we should
present Shakespeare and call it
“dumbing down”. I remember my
first time at the theatre in
Stratford being very disappointed
when the RSC did “Taming of the
Shrew” in modern costume with a
motorbike. Nowadays I have seen
enough theatre to think there is
occasion for both the original
words and settings and these new
interpretations. They appeal to
different audiences and world is

big enough for both. Either
presentation, if well played, will
tell of people convincing
themselves of their right to power
and influence at the expense of
others. Both may appeal to
different audiences and then there
are folk like me who enjoy both.
For me what really matters is that
they entertain while still made a
powerful point.

The worship in our local churches
and chapels have another very
special story to tell. They too tell
that story these days in many
different ways. Some services are
traditional using Shakespearian
language and costumes; relying
on dignity and awe to bring the
congregation nearer to God.
Others are in modern language
and use power point and modern
musical arrangements to provide
an atmosphere of enthusiastic
worship and a more visual
presentation. Some start with
crafting play dough models or
building an Easter Garden or
lighting a bonfire. All are
different styles or celebration but
it is the story that is told that
matters.

If you have not been to church or
chapel for a while why don't you
come along and see what we do
these days? We have Harvest
services and Praise services
advertised in other parts of the
Link. We have traditional
services too. The important thing
is that we have a story to tell that
I am sure will really interest you.
Do come.

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Notes from The Herald,

October 1911

Fine, warm, dry but cold snap
(snow on the tops) on 26th.
Autumn tints by 14th.

Orton The Westmorland County
Council Dairy Van was in Orton
mid October to instruct lasses in
butter-making. A lot came and
passed their exam by Newton
Rigg staff. David Robinson,
shoemaker, was caught poaching
on Orton Hall's shooting land.
He was fined £2 plus costs and
given one month to pay; his nets
were forfeited but his gun
returned to him. Squire Goodwin
of the Hall left the Bench during
this trial. Orton Bible Society's
AGM was on Monday 16th in the
Temperance Hall, the vicar was in
the Chair. There was a talk on
the Society in Siberia and
Manchuria.

Married at Orton Church on 11th,
Thomas Petty of Plumtree Hall to
Mary Ann Horsfall, Sunbiggin.
Died at Cross Green in late
September, Mrs. Robert Clarke
only daughter of the late Joseph
and Sarah Moffat. She was 68, a
native of Orton, a Wesleyan and
very hospitable. There was a big
funeral.

Greenholme Rovers F.C.'s Social
on the evening of 12th. It was
held in St. Andrews Rooms,
Penrith. 70 couples were dancing

and there was whist and supper
too. There was an admission
charge for this event. Wanted for
Greenholme Council School, a
female certificated Head Teacher.
Tebay's proposed new
footbridge: the R.D.C., heard that
the County Council will pay one
third of its cost. What will Tebay
folk give? Also London wants to
know what the R.D.C. is doing
about the diarrhoea in Tebay.
The railway companies say the
Council needs to empty the
cesspits more often. The council
says it was an unusually hot
summer but will empty them
more often in summer. Tebay's
St. John's Ambulance
Association meeting was in
Tebay Station waiting room on
Sunday 8th October. Mr. W.A.
Mellor (Station-master) was
presiding and there was an
election of officers. Westmorland
County Council wants Tebay to
have a third R.D. Councillor and
Guardian of the Poor (i.e.
Workhouses Committee); by 21st
this was Mr. R.G. Parker, farmer
of Borrowdale, Tebay. The death
took place of Mr. Joseph
Ratcliffe, Low Moor Cottages
near Tebay, on Monday evening,
2nd October. He was aged 84 and
had been railway lengthsman for
Shap Summit to Tebay. As a boy
he helped build the line from

Grayrigg Station to Bess Gill
(north of Thrimby). He was hale
and hearty for sixty years and had
lived in his Low Moor Cottage
for 63 years since the Railway
Company built it. He had been
retired for 9 years and had been a
gardener all his life. His funeral
on 14th was at Orton.

Ravenstonedale R.D.,C. is to
sewer Coldbeck. The
Ravenstonedale Band of Hope
lecture was on 18th in the Public
Room, a lot there. The Harvest
Festival was at St. Oswald's on
8th – a choral service, Newbiggin
Church's was Friday 6th and 8th.

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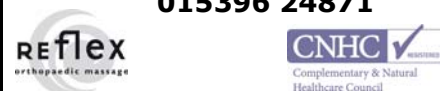
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Kasese update

We have just heard from Orton's link church in Uganda, All Saints, Kasese. On the 26th August an email was received from the Lay Reader, Zziwa Robert:

"Receive warm greetings to you all from All Saints Church, Kasese. We want to extend our sincere thanks to you for all what you are doing for the expansion of the heavenly kingdom here on earth and hence glorifying the name of our risen Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, son of the most high God. On development, we want to inform you that we started constructing the permanent shelter for the flock of God on Wednesday 10th August 2011. However we are going ahead though we are meeting challenge of rise of commodities since inflation in Uganda is very high. We look forward to more support in prayers and advises as God blesses you richly. Thank you for your ministerial co-operation with us. We love you and may God keep our link with you form and prosperous in Jesus' name."

In this picture you can see the ramshackle wooden building used as a church at present (where I preached in 2008 and 2010), with the new building work in the foreground.

They expected it to take up to ten years to raise the funds to build their new church, by their members giving week by week, but evidently want to start now with what funds they have before prices rise further.

"Children of Hope" in Kendal Church

Holy Trinity Parish Church, Kirkland, Kendal, is hosting an unusual Photographic Exhibition from 14th October to 12th November.



Entitled "Children of Hope", the evocative black-and-white photographs illustrate the life of a group of street children in Kasese, south-western Uganda. The photographer, award-winning photojournalist Carol Allen-Storey, spent time with these youngsters in November 2009, getting to know them, and hearing their stories of how they ended up living on the streets and searching for scraps of food in the town rubbish dumps; but as well as the wretchedness, she discovered the ways in which they care for each other, and some of their hopes for the future. Her captions

to her photographs movingly describe these.

The Exhibition is being mounted by Cumbria-based charity, "Kasese Street Kids", started and run by retired Barrow Vicar Christopher Jenkin and his wife Mary (<http://kasesestreetkids.blogspot.com>). They met this group of street children when visiting Uganda with missionary friends in March 2008, and felt powerfully moved to take action to help them. Since then over £35,000 has been raised, mostly through the great generosity of Cumbrian people, and a substantial Hostel has been built (though still unfinished). They were given permission by Carol Allen-Storey to use her photographs to raise awareness of the plight of these children – as she said, "to give a voice to the voiceless".

A thought from Tebay

I think that well over 90% of homes in this country were horrified to see the rioting and fires which occurred in August this year – London, Birmingham, Bristol, Liverpool and Manchester to name a few. Some of the later ones were obvious ‘copy cat’ happenings of London. We have criticised the police for not acting swiftly enough but have we thought about why these happened. From past history August appears to be the month for this type of behaviour to emerge – pupils on holiday from school (and there were many of them) older teenagers with no jobs but plenty of benefits and this time young men and women in their twenties and thirties. Many of the residents in these particular areas were quite adamant that the troublemakers and looters were not from that area.

When I was a teenager in the 1950’s there were three main groups of people who influenced us – the family and extended family, the church and the schools. We knew that we did not answer back, let alone walk away when we were reprimanded, we knew what time to be in the house at night, we knew how to behave in church and how to join in the services, we knew that we had to go to school, work to the best of our ability and certainly we did not defy adults. Why did we behave like this? Many of us had parents and grandparents who grew up in the Victorian era and Edwardian era when children were expected to be seen and not heard – adults would never ask the opinion of anyone who was younger than themselves. How many of us remember the expression – ‘because I said so and I am your mother/father’? Fortunately we live in more enlightened times. Young people at school and at home are expected to have an

opinion about many things. Unfortunately of the 3 groups who used to influence us have now become one group – the school and sometimes they struggle as many pupils do not know or understand the meaning of respect. In the home I wonder what percentage of families have an evening meal sitting together around the table with no TV on in the background and talk about the day’s events. How many families go to church together?

In 1901 Lord Baden Powell was asked to form an organisation for boys to belong to and when he held the first camp at Brownsee Island he took an equal number of boys from well healed families and boys from a much, much poorer background to show them that background did not matter. Boy Scouts and Girl Guides are still flourishing worldwide but not all young people want to belong to a uniformed organisation. In the first half of the last century young people belonged to something – Boys Brigade, Girls Brigade, Youth Clubs, Boys Clubs a school club and Sunday School. I can remember my grandmother going to the women’s Sunday school class on a Sunday afternoon (my grandfather was the Superintendent) but there was class for every age group. What has happened? Is it just that budgets have been cut – there are no grants for these extra activities or is it that more women go out to work and working hours appear to be longer so that there are not as

many adults to run these clubs

In the TV interviews this August some young people were interviewed who said that they had nothing to do and nobody ‘respects’ them. They do not seem to understand that respect has to be earned. Various politicians have suggested that housing benefit be taken away – but councils will still have to rehouse people. Young people who truant, who loot and willingly get caught up in the riots when still at school – does the government take away the child benefit in order to make the parents take more responsibility for their children? Are we giving older teenagers and adults too much in benefits so that they see no point in working? Should all people on housing, unemployment support allowance, income support, council tax benefit, incapacity benefit, disability benefit and industrial injuries benefit somehow contribute towards the benefit by doing voluntary work? This would also mean that more people would have to be employed to supervise this at a time when the police, county and district councils and many manufacturing firms are today shedding staff.

I could write much more; but the debate is – do we leave it to our politicians to sort out or do we in our villages, towns and communities try to help with these problems?

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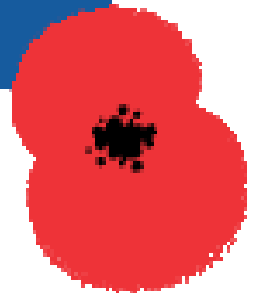

Local Distinctiveness Project Update

Action with Communities in Cumbria (ACT)

New tourism Leaflet for Orton & Tebay

The sun shone for the launch of the new 'Visit Orton & Tebay' leaflet which was held at the George Hotel in Orton. This fabulous new publication promotes the hidden gems of this beautiful area highlighting the stunning scenery, history and heritage, activities and events and places to sample and savour local food. The leaflet provides intriguing snippets of information to tempt people to visit and find out more, whether it is information about walking and cycling, the railway heritage of the area or how the landscape has shaped the communities.

What makes this leaflet particularly special is the huge input the local people have had in planning the content and supplying the information and photos. It has been marvellous to be able to work with a group who are so enthusiastic about the area in which they live and

work. A huge Thank You to all involved.

The leaflet has been produced as the result of a joint project between Eden Tourism (Eden District Council) and Action with Communities in Cumbria (ACT) which has been supporting local tourism businesses through the Tebay and Orton Local Distinctiveness Development Project. Eden Tourism Manager Jessica Goodfellow commented 'We are delighted with this new leaflet which joins a series of existing Eden leaflets promoting the fantastic localities in the area. This has been a true partnership project with the local community from start to finish.'

ACT established the project to work with the communities of Tebay and Orton to research and celebrate the heritage that makes this neighbourhood distinctive and to help raise awareness of and pride in the locality. This has also led to the development of the

Lunesdale Archaeology Society who were supported with training and specialist expertise throughout the dig at Low Borrowbridge Roman Fort earlier in the year

Tebay Walks Leaflet and Podcast:

ACT will now be joining forces with the Cumbria Wildlife Trust's High Fells Project to create an exhibition and leaflet of round walks with a downloadable oral history pod-cast. This will feature recordings of local people talking about their memories of the area and sharing information about the farming and transport heritage, wildlife and fascinating landscapes through which the walks pass. **Why not come along and get involved? All Welcome.**

A planning meeting will be held on Wed 12th Oct 7.30 at The Cross Keys Inn, Tebay.

Oral History Workshop:

Come along and learn how to use the recording equipment and learn all about the dos and don'ts of undertaking oral history recordings to preserve the memories of local people for the future. This free workshop will be run by the North West Sound Archive and is aimed at anyone who wants to get involved with recording interviews for the oral history pod-casts that will accompany the Tebay walks leaflet.

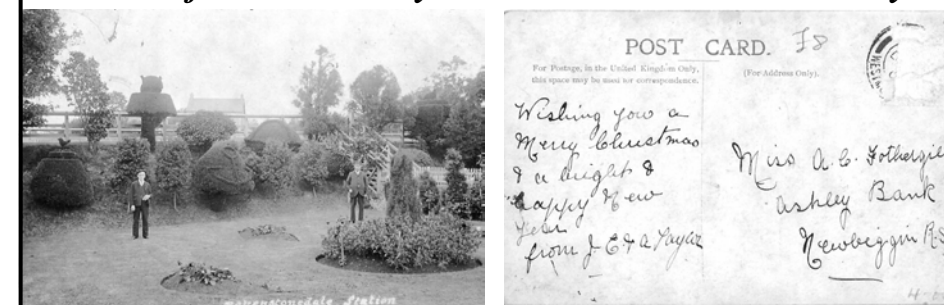
