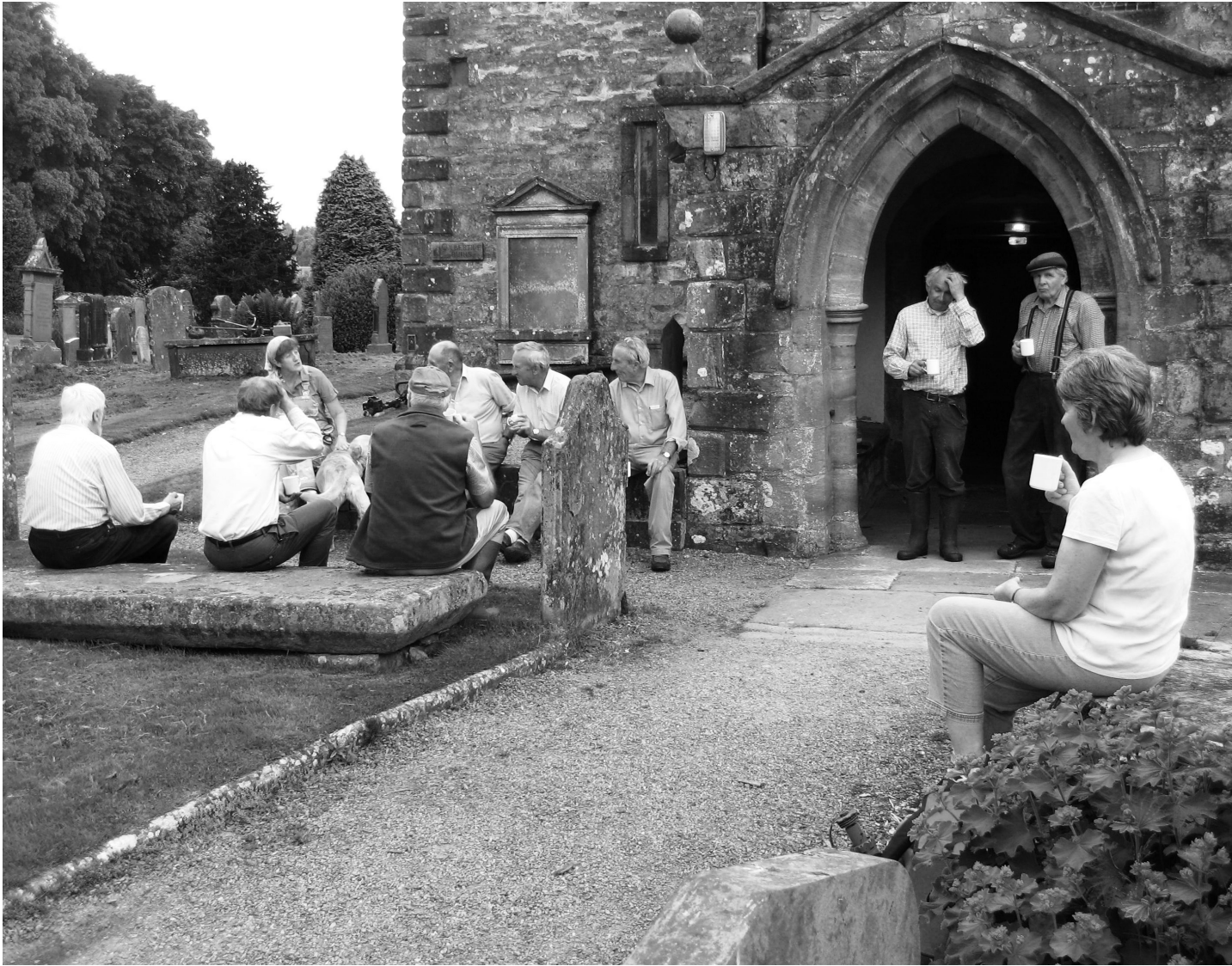

A thought from the Vicarage.

Jesus was once asked 'Who is my neighbour?' It was an attempt to catch him out.

So instead of answering directly Jesus told a story.

It was the story of the Good Samaritan.

The story goes that a man was travelling the famously dangerous road from Jerusalem to Jerusalem. He was set upon by thieves who stole all he had, beat him and left him for dead.

A man who was recognised as a religious leader came along. He saw the man but rather than risk his religious privileges he passed by on the other side of the road.

Then a man who knew all that there was to know about the laws of the local religion and culture came by. He too did nothing to help but walked past on the other side of the road.

A Samaritan whose tribe for generation had hated the tribe of the injured man came by. He did all in his power to care for the man, bound his wounds and forsaking his own comfort and putting himself at risk of being attacked in his turn, put the man on his donkey and took him to a place of safety. There he left money for others to care for the man and promised to pay any shortfall of funds on his return.

The question was asked by a man who wanted to 'justify' himself. What he wanted Jesus to say was that as long as he looked after his friends, his family, those of his own tribe who lived close to him then he had discharged his obligation to his 'neighbour'. Instead Jesus challenged every presupposition the questioner had. Keeping all the religious rules in the world does no good at all if the heart is not moved by concern for those dealt a bad hand in life.

In the same way knowing all the laws and customs of your group – your tribe - is no good if it taught you only to keep your concern for those who are 'like you'. It is the one who embraces the stranger, the outsider, the one who is a bit different or who is socially awkward or sad or disadvantaged – when we accept them and treat them with respect – even in the tiny little ways of talking to them, making eye contact, passing the time of day

Jesus asked,
'Who was the neighbour to the man?'

The questioner replied,
'The one that showed him kindness.'

Jesus said:
'Go and do likewise'.

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Notes from The Herald, August/September 1913.

Two fine, sunny months.
National motorcycling trials, 11-16
Aug. based in Carlisle, had them
come via Orton and Tebay on 12th.

Orton's Vicar and Churchwardens
sought a faculty to insert an
underground heating chamber next
to the present one and to erect a
new strong-room at the church's
west end. The Diocese Chancellor
granted the first, but adjourned the
second saying "Your successor
might want it demolished".
Married in Ravenstonedale
Congregational Church on 10th,
Walter Henry, son of John Pearson
of Yanwath to Charlotte, 3rd
daughter of Jonathon Guy,
Ravenstonedale.

Ravenstonedale Sheepdog Trials
and Sport on Sat 30th (John Butt,
Secretary), a local day off for
farmers, was in haze but dry. It
was in the usual field lent by Mr.
T.D. Handley, Park House. Lots
were there; many visitors and a big
house party at Coldbeck House.
Tebay won the football
competition. Mr. Thomas Todd,
Tranmere, Newbiggin on Lune,
farmer, died there on 26th August.
Aged 69 he was ill. Born in
Ravenstonedale he was married and
a local preacher (Primitive
Methodist). A big funeral was
shared by the Vicar and P.M.
Superintendent.

September R.D.C. seeks site for

Tebay Water Supplies Railway to
be charged £25p.a. min. for water
and £5.5.0 for legal advice. Dr.
Gibson said that at Whinfell
Terrace, North Terrace and South

privies abominable. WCs are
needed but it's no good referring
this to the Tebay Parochial
Committee as they oppose all
reforms and the railway companies
are evasive. As for epidemics "the
long way the R.D.C. deals with
them is a farce from beginning to
end" – Dr. Gibson.

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A VIEW FROM TEBAY

September is almost upon us as I compose this article, but perhaps we can still look forward to some decent weather – a so-called “Indian Summer”. At least we have something approaching a proper summer this year, with the weather too hot for some of us at times but nevertheless very pleasant.

Now autumn is fast approaching with all the attendant activities it brings – the start of the football season and the drawing-in of the days. Where St. James’ is concerned it also brings a new venture by the “Friends” – the setting up of a Library Hun with books displayed in the entrance to the lower floor. We have already had over a hundred books of various kinds delivered and shelved, ready for the first Monday in September when we hope a good number of local people will come and inspect the books, enjoy a “cuppa” and a chat and socialise for a while between the hours of ten and midday. As a long-time regular user of the mobile library – on average I take out ten books a month – and the main Kendal library, I am looking forward to selecting some reading matter for the winter months. I will be in attendance most weeks along with some of the other people who have already volunteered to be librarians and I am confident that the facility will be well patronised once it gets going.

Also in September, we Anglicans are going to begin to share more services with our Methodist friends, starting on the first Sunday, and also joining them for a combined Harvest service later in the month. This is not to be confused with a combine harvester which may

also be seen about the area very soon. These combined services will be advertised well in advance in the *Link* and we hope they will prove successful, given the change in circumstances when Phil moves to Kirkby Stephen to live.

I mentioned football earlier and I know that very soon I will be attending matches both with Lunesdale involved and a Westmorland representative side, but before that I already have the Agenda(with 21 items) for a Board Meeting to take place on the same evening as the next History Society, when I was looking forward to hearing Bernard’s talk on Ravenstonedale. I will be obliged to attend the Board Meeting as there will be a number of decisions to take for the new season.

This is one of the slight annoyances in my life, when events clash, but compared to the problems some folk confront these are minor occurrences. There are several families in the community at present who are suffering greatly because of ill-health. We at St. James’ regularly remember them all in our prayers.

One of the highlights of the past week or so was the Tebay Soccer School, which was held this year in the big field opposite The Howe. I wondered down on the last afternoon to watch the games and was struck by what a great venue it was. Not only was there plenty of room for the pitches but also the car-parking area was more than ample. If all the vehicles had been parked near the Recreation Ground there would have been chaos in the village. As well as the 90+ children playing with such enthusiasm it was great to see so many teenage volunteers doing their bit.

At the end of September I will be taking a short break in Staffordshire to help my cousin to cope while her neighbours are

away. I will make full use of my bus pass to tour the West Midlands and recharge my batteries for the strain of the “dark days before Christmas” as my mum’s oldest sister used to call November and December.

One evening event I am really looking forward to before I go away is the Slide Show at Shap Wells celebrating John Falshaw’s 50 years at Orton. I have John during that time as a dedicated Head Teacher, a staunch worker for the Church and – in his younger days – a good cricketer. He is, of course, also a Yorkshireman but having spent 20-odd years living in Leeds I do not hold that against him.

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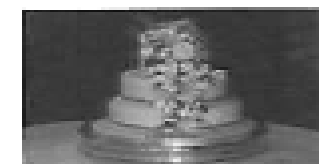
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Cross Keys Inn, Tebay Change of Direction

ANNUAL MEETING 8th JULY 2013
Present:- Officers: Kyle Blue (chairman), Wendy Higgins (steward), Richard Percival (Treasurer), Chris Jenkin (Minutes Secretary).

1. Minutes of the AGM held on Monday 2nd July 2012: These were agreed unanimously.
2. Chairman's Remarks: Kyle Blue reported that it had been a very busy year for the Manor Court,
3. Steward's Report: Wendy Higgins reported :
a. Most important – the Manor Court was now fully insured, to the relief of herself and the chairman..
b. Grazing at Meldykes and Howes Quarry had been let, and rent for one had been received. The process of putting Meldykes into "Stewardship" – a form of management with extra care, restricting grazing, to encourage heather and wild flowers – was under way.
c. Jubilee:
i. A red hawthorn tree had been planted in Carsa Brow.
ii. Pauline Henderson was half way through producing an Information Board for the village
iii. Orton Primary School had been offered £500 to mark the Jubilee and had decided to spend it on a sensory garden, which is under construction; they are likely to put in a request for further funding.
iv. The Dame School: Norman Watson has installed a new window and door, and Lanty Wharton replaced gutters and repointed the building. They charged for materials only; it was proposed and agreed that letters of appreciation be sent.
v. Jan Hicks had indexed all OMC documents.
d. Still to be done: Clear the becks; survey all trees on OMC land – Rob Willan has been asked to take the ancient role of "Tree Looker"
e. Apologies have been given to residents of Raisbeck, who were not properly consulted about the planting of 84 trees and erection of a fence on the verge.
f. If asked what OMC money is spent on, it includes insurance premium, information board, the school jubilee gift, and beck cleaning; a contingency fund to maintain the Dame School might be needed, and possible expenditure on Layby by Silver Yard.
4. Treasurer's report - Richard Percival reported: Balances 4th July 2012 totalled £10,292.07
Income (including grass lettings, Single Farm Payment, Rights of Way and Wayleaves) was £2,027.50
Expenditure (Water Rates for Meldykes, Hall hire, Dame School repairs, School Jubilee donation, insurance with NFU, Liberal Club research) was £1,804.61.
Surplus: £290.14
Closing balance: £10,582.21

5. Other Matters Raised:
a. Liberal Club: Mary Jenkin reported on the situation regarding this, and the work of an Action Group:
• They had successfully opposed the tenant registering ownership of the building
• They had traced and contacted Neville Gibson, son of Kathleen Gibson who had set up the Trust in 1974 on behalf of the village youth, now living in Adelaide.
• They had discussed various ideas for future use of the building; while grants would be available for refurbishment and restoration, ways of funding of running costs would have to be explored.
• She had met Neville Gibson, who had visited Orton in June and inspected the building. He said that he wants his mother's wishes to be honoured for the sake of the youth of Orton, but a new Trust would not be set up; he was consulting a solicitor about how ownership of the building could be transferred to the village – perhaps to the Parish Council or to Orton Manor Court. Meanwhile the Trust is being wound up.
• Anyone interested in future developments was invited to join the Action Group or to ask for emailed reports.
b. Lay-by by Silver Yard: as the unsightly state of this had been discussed by the Committee and had also been the subject of a letter by a concerned resident, Christopher Jenkin had done some research and gave the Meeting a Powerpoint presentation of possible options – different kinds of surfaces (tarmac, concrete, perforated paving of various kinds), closing the lay-by completely or enlarging it to allow more parking. After considerable discussion votes on options were taken:
• To close it and block it off: 4 in favour, the rest against.
• To enlarge it to allow parking of up to 12 cars facing the road: heavily defeated.
• To place rocks to mark the limits of the lay-by – agreed.
• To defer any substantial resurfacing, and try to keep the existing surface in good repair: agreed. Geoff Lambert offered to trim the edges occasionally.
• Verge between bridge and hearse house: Chris Bland said that the rocks that had been placed there to prevent parking on the verge were completely invisible in long grass; this should be rectified to prevent damage to vehicles.
There being no further business, the meeting closed at 8.38 p.m. The next meeting of the Committee is on Monday 29th July at 7.30 p.m.

Abridged Minutes of the Committee Meeting held on Monday 29th July 2013
PRESENT: 9 committee members and two visitors. There were three apologies.
Minutes
Minutes of the Committee Meeting on Monday 8th April 2013 were accepted.
Minutes of the AGM on 8th July: a number of errors would be corrected.
Matters Arising from the Minutes:
Howes Quarry drainage: a fence had been erected to keep horses off the boggiest ground.
Dame School: an Information Board had been erected inside the School. An offer to limewash the interior walls was accepted. The path to the front door had been mown.
Cutting of Verges: It was reported that the cutting policy agreed in 2002-5 was *not* being followed: in 2012 in one area three separate contractors were cutting both sides in early September, and cuttings were not being collected. This was seriously damaging the wild flowers and butterfly population. It was AGREED that an official letter would be sent from

OMC to CCC, and Councillor Libby Bateman would be kept informed.

Planters in the Square: Helen Wearmouth and Graham Leckie (who is a gardener) had volunteered to maintain the planters in the Square which had become very neglected. They intended:

- To remove all dead material
- To replace a lot of the soil
- To dispose of unwanted vegetation
- To suggest a fresh planting, and report to the next Committee meeting with a budget.

There would be an item in the September issue of *Link* to inform residents.

Concern was also expressed about weeds in various areas around the Hall and Square, but it was reported that this had recently been sprayed by the Council.

Grateful thanks were expressed to Graham and Helen.

Beck clearing: The right time to do it was the spring and action would then be taken.

Meldykes: Doubts had been expressed whether Meldykes, at 4 hectares, was big enough to qualify for a Stewardship grant. It could be added (without affecting ownership) to adjoining land already in Higher Stewardship. This was felt more likely to be accepted for a grant, which might total about £800 p.a.

School donation: A letter from Orton School was read expressing gratitude for OMC's donation of £500. A further £225 had been raised by the sale of plants, and other donations raised £150. There had been a lot of voluntary work; hard landscaping had been constructed. There was now little money left for items important to the children such as a tree house, benches and plants, and a further donation would be appreciated. It was AGREED to donate a further £250.

Layby next to Silver Yard: Allan would after consultation with the Steward lay some large stones around the edges. Limiting the length of the layby was felt to be the main priority.

The need for more car parking in the village would be brought to the Parish Council by the Steward.

Any Other Business

Jubilee Tree Plaque: The existing quotations were felt to be too high, and enquiries would be made about cheaper options.

Information Board: concern was expressed that the Committee had never been given any indication on the likely cost of this.

Date of next meeting: Monday 30th September 2013.

The planters in the Square

Helen Wearmouth and Graham Leckie have offered to refurbish and replant the much neglected planters in the Square, on behalf of the Manor Court.

This autumn they plan to cut back some of the shrubs and take out the dead ones.

After that they are going to add new soil and feed it so that it will be ready for new planting in the spring.

Football at Warcop

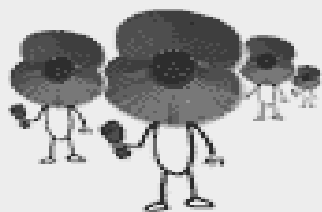
On Monday 2nd July 2013 we went to play a football

Quarterly Report

from the District Councillor for Ravenstonedale

I must apologize for not writing last quarter, but I was in the process of having an operation from which I am now fully recovered.

The process of dealing with the footway lighting problem is moving forward. All the village parish councils (or meetings) concerned have now responded, and most of them have done their best to assess their lighting and give useful information. I have been asked to chair the scrutiny review which will report to The Executive with its recommendations in time for them to come to Council in November. This will be no easy task.

The project to bring EDC all on to one single site at The Town Hall is still alive, but it may well depend on borrowing money, and paying it back over a considerable period using income received from The Mansion House site. As a Group the Liberal Democrats are in favour in principle of bringing the Council on to one site, but we are wary of the risk of taking on such a debt, and we are looking carefully at the details as they become available.

Finally, I am pleased to say that The Upper Eden Neighbourhood plan is now in force, and will still be applicable if parts of the ward go into The Dales National Park as proposed. The first planning applications in the country to be approved under such a plan were in Ravenstonedale Ward. It was disappointing that The Herald did not even give it a mention.

Cobweb Orchestra Concert

The inaugural Cobweb Chamber concert took place on the evening of Saturday 28th July in St Oswald's Church in Ravenstonedale. The Orchestra of amateur musicians had travelled from all over the North of England. This group of musicians had spent a weekend staying at Blackton Grange in Baldersdale rehearsing the music for this concert.

The Concert included Mozart's Overture for The Marriage of Figaro; Ravel's Le Tombeau de Couperin, Mendelssohn's Hebridean Overture and Rossetti's Sinfonia di Caccia added to the wide variety of the music. The main symphony was Schubert's 6th Symphony: it was composed between October 1817 and February 1818 and nicknamed the "Little 'C' Major" to distinguish it from his 9th Symphony also in C major known as the "Great". The interval refreshments, provided by Ann Brownrigg, Marjorie Beattie and Caroline Morris were enjoyed by the 32 members of the orchestra and the audience of more than 70. The generous donations from the enthusiastic and appreciative audience amounted to £347 to be shared between St Oswald's Church and the Cobweb Orchestra.

The local Cobweb Orchestra starts again on Sept 10th 7.30 pm in Tebay Methodist Church under the baton of Peter Crompton. It is an open access orchestra, no auditions! Just come along and play. UPPER EDEN COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS

The Upper Eden Community First Responder Team was first formed in late 2009. Initially all team members received training from North West Ambulance Service, which was followed by an assessment in which every member has to successfully pass; this assessment is carried out annually. On completion of this initial period, UECFRs went live in February 2010. First Responders are alerted when an ambulance is dispatched, and to date the team have been called out to over 400 incidents in an area running from North Stainmore, Mallerstang, Kirkby Stephen to Newbiggin-on-Lune, plus villages throughout the Upper Eden Valley.

As First Responder teams are totally voluntary and have to finance most of the equipment themselves, including the callout system to alert members when an emergency occurs, fund raising is a major challenge. Part of the kit required is an "Automated External Defibrillator" or AED which is used to help start a person's heart that has suffered a cardiac arrest. Each of these units costs up to a £1,000.

Much of the money raised locally is by the UPFR Lottery which is run every month and for which we thank the many people who take part.
