Church Leader's Letter

From the Revd. Stewart Fyfe, Rural Dean

Katsushika Hokusai was a great Japanese artist of the late 18th, early 19th century. It is said that he once painted a vase with a beautiful view of Mount Fujiyama. It was a masterpiece. But one day, someone broke the vase. So Hokusai painstakingly glued it back together, but as he did so, he wove a thread of gold into each join, so that the breakage would only add to its beauty. The vase was acclaimed more wondrous than ever.

Something like that has taken place amongst us in the events of Easter. The Bible recounts how God pronounced his creation 'good', but that it had been broken by sin. When Jesus died on the Cross, it was, for his followers, as though the most beautiful thing in God's creation had been broken. But to their amazement, it was not the end of the story. Jesus returned to life and the crucifixion wounds in his hands, feet and side became wonderful symbols to his disciples of the transformation Jesus' resurrection brought about. It spoke not only of the hope they now had before them, but also of the journey they had taken to get to this place. The wounds that once were fatal were now glorious and made the end of the story more wonderful than the beginning.

The whole of life can feel like this. We begin life full of hope – apparently endless options open before us and all the time in the world to pursue them. Then comes a time when the options

close down, and a further time when the things we chose are taken away from us. This happens at many points in life, but is even more apparent as we get older. It is easy in those situations to think that the beauty in life is over, that the vase (metaphorically speaking) is broken for good.

These experiences are common to all humanity, but the experience of faith is that Jesus repeatedly puts our lives back together out of the brokenness in ways that are even more wonderful than what we had before. The Bible doesn't fully explain why bad things happen, but it does point towards the promise that Jesus is in those things with us, like Hokusai's thread of gold, and that he can redeem any situation, restoring us not just to where we were before disaster struck, but to something even better – a deeper happiness, a truer truth, a fuller hope. And his own resurrection is the guarantee of that promise. Like Hokusai and his vase we can trust to Jesus' eternal creativity to bring, out of every situation, something more wonderful than we can imagine. All he requires is our faith. In my experience, he does it time and again in this life, so I trust him also to do the same in what lies beyond this life. Whatever is going on in your life at the moment, I wish you a Happy Easter.

Notes from the Herald, April 1916

Mostly fine and dry, warmest in first week. First cuckoo heard on 21st (Good Friday).

Glycerine is now by prescription only; it's needed for explosives. All houses must have dark opaque blinds lowered at night. War reports must exclude place names. The War will cost us at least £509 million this year; the Government is borrowing £1323 million (2016 multiply by 80. No wonder Silverpen was appalled!). Britain is to supply the Russian Army with 9 million boots so ours will be scarce and dear as civilians.

No news from Orton or Tebay other than of their Good Friday services – 2 at Orton, 3 at Tebay Church and the Tebay Primitive Methodists' Anniversary was then too. Ravenstonedale has 40 ladies making Soldiers' Comforts. This winter they've made 406 garments and 139 pairs of socks. On Good Friday the Congregational Church had its annual Tea (all food given) and Service (2 anthems). Died at Studfold, Fell End, on Saturday 22nd, of flu and pneumonia, Mr. Haygarth Askew, farmer aged 55. He was an active member of Fell End Wesleyan Chapel.

A concert for War Charities was given by the pupils of Ravenstonedale Endowed School on the evening on Monday, 24th. It made £12 for Minesweepers' Comforts.

The fatal Isle of Wight Disease is now killing bees near Penrith. It began in the I of W and has come steadily north.

Prices are slightly cheaper this month. Mrs. Thornborrow (Tebay) sent a wreath to the funeral of Mr. Robert Fothergill, one of Brough's roadmen.

A Vet writes: Dog with asthma? – No cure. Don't cosset it. Constipated sow? – make her walk to the trough; feed her on roots. Dog with fits? – pour cold water on its head or put it in a warm bath.

A Christian Alphabet—An occasional series by Christopher Jenkin

Repentance: This is commonly, but wrongly, understood to mean "saying sorry". It is much, much more than that. The Greek word, *Metanoia*, has two parts: "*meta*" meaning change, and "*noia*" meaning mind: a change of mind, but one which leads to a change of direction. Imagine an adulterous man driving from home to visit his mistress. On the way, he feels guilty – but that is not enough. He changes his mind; he does a U-turn in his car, and returns home to heal his relationship with his betrayed wife. That is repentance. A parable of Jesus illustrates it: the "prodigal son" (Luke 15: 11-24), who leaves home with all he can grab, lives a corrupt and spendthrift life, and then "comes to himself": "I will go to my father, and say to him, 'Father, I have sinned...'" Result: the father comes running to meet him for tearful and joyful reconciliation. Repentance for us therefore means realising our life is going in the wrong direction, namely away from God; changing our mind, turning around, and moving – perhaps hesitantly, uncertainly, even reluctantly – towards God; and then finding he comes running to meet and embrace us. That is repentance!

Resurrection: What better word to consider in the Easter season? Resurrection is at the heart of the Christian faith. Indeed Paul wrote that if there is no resurrection from the dead, and Christ did not rise from death, literally, then there *is* no Christian faith, and "Christians" are just pathetic losers who should abandon the whole thing. (*I Corinthians 15: 16-19*). There are three accounts of Jesus raising dead people to life (the widow's son, the synagogue-leader's daughter, and Lazarus, brother of Mary and Martha) – but that was not "resurrection", because they all three eventually died. But true resurrection is that of Jesus himself; crucified, dead and buried on Friday; still and cold in the tomb on Saturday; and gloriously alive, joyful, triumphant, loving and hungry on Sunday, never to die again! Unbelievers have been trying to deny or explain away the Bible accounts ever since – he didn't really die but recovered, his disciples stole the body, the priests or the Romans stole the body, it was all mass hysteria and they just imagined they saw him.... But the contortions people have to go through to make these wild theories seem convincing make actual faith in a resurrected Lord more straightforward! And apart from the sober accounts of eye-witnesses, the very existence of the world-wide Christian church, with twenty centuries of men and women of all cultures whose lives have been changed and turned around by Jesus, is perhaps the most powerful evidence of all.

Sugar cane in Tebay?!

On the evening of 4th March it looked like sugar
cane was growing at the Hub in Tebay! Every year, on
the first Friday in March, Women's World Day of
Prayer is celebrated by over 170 countries around the
world – 6,000 services take place in UK alone.

Twenty-six of us from all the local churches met for
this year's service, planned by the Christian women of
Cuba. The props included some lovely handcrafted
sugar cane. We were greeted with homemade
lemonade as is the Cuban custom, made by Angela,
who also made some excellent rum and lime cake from
a Cuban recipe. Cuba's national flower is the white
butterfly jasmine, a symbol of the resistance and
struggle for freedom by the Cuban people; on arrival
each person was given a paper flower on which to
write their name, and later these were given out for us
each to pray for the person named on our flower.

Cuban music is very lively so we were accompanied by keyboard, guitar and
various percussion instruments which added atmosphere to our evening together, as
we praised God and prayed for the women of Cuba.



The theme of the service was "Receive children.
Receive me". It was lovely to have three children
with us who did readings and joined in the lively
music. Afterwards Elaine entertained the children
with Cuban crafts.

Next year's service will be prepared by the
women of the Philippines; our service will be held
at Newbiggin-on-Lune Methodist Chapel.

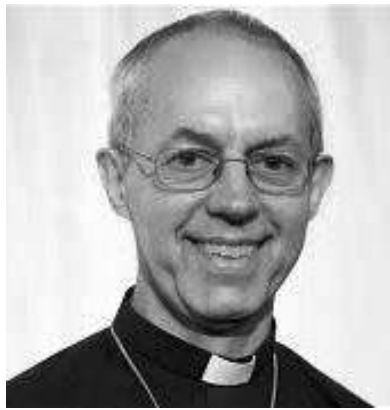

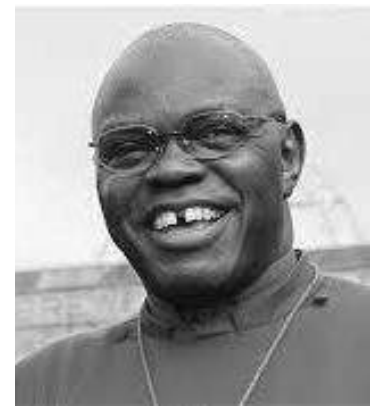

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are taking the unprecedented step of writing to every serving parish priest in the Church of England inviting you and your people to join us in a week of prayer for the evangelisation of our nation. In the week leading up to Pentecost (May 8th - 15th, 2016) we long to see a great wave of prayer across our land, throughout the Church of England and many other Churches.

Our hope is

- ♦ for all Christians to deepen their relationship with Jesus Christ
- ♦ for all of us to have confidence to share the Gospel
- ♦ for all to respond to the call of Jesus Christ to follow Him as disciples, to live out the Gospel and to seek God's Kingdom from day to day

At the heart of our prayers will be the words that Jesus Christ himself taught us - **'Thy kingdom come, thy will be done.'** It is impossible to overstate the life-transforming power of the Lord's Prayer. It is a prayer that is reassuring enough to be on the lips of the dying and yet dangerous enough to be banned in cinemas. It is famous enough to be spoken each day by billions in hundreds of languages and yet intimate enough to draw us ever closer into friendship with Jesus Christ. It is simple enough to be memorised by small children and yet profound enough to sustain a whole lifetime of prayer. When we pray it with sincerity and with joy, there is no imagining the new ways in which God can use us to his glory.

We profoundly hope that you and those you serve will want to be part of this great movement of prayer. Evangelism is the work of God, and it begins as we seek him in prayer. AFRICAN EVENING AT ORTON

Over seventy people crowded into Orton Market Hall for a fascinating African Evening on 12th March. Five people who had visited Uganda in November 2015 – Ian Elliott, David Merritt, Felicity Lawler, and Chris and Mary Jenkin – were sharing their experiences with vivid videos and photographs.



But first there was an African-style meal, preceded by an African-style hand-washing: warm water was poured over guests' hands, and soap and towels offered, by three children. Then the food: traditional African goat meat was replaced by delicious

lamb (from Felicity's own flock); there was chicken, hard-boiled eggs, rice, stuffed chapattis, salads and boiled potatoes (known as "Irish" in Uganda); and dessert was watermelon, pineapple and bananas.

The 15-strong Tebay Community Choir, conducted by Alison Mott, then gave a superb rendering

of African music from several countries, both quiet lullabies and lively, rhythmic songs which set everyone's feet tapping; it included a delightful solo by 8-year-old Cristina Jenkin-Gallego.

The presentation of pictures, still and moving, from the various parts of the trip through Uganda, was



fascinating, and sometimes hilarious (the toddler dancing joyfully during the children's choir singing at the church dedication service brought the house down!). The exuberant worship at All Saints' Church, Kasese (linked with All Saints, Orton); the excitement of schoolchildren receiving gifts from their link schools in Shap and Orton; the health and social care given to neonatal or disabled children at Kisiizi and Rukungiri; the visit to the Kasese street kids hostel funded by donations largely from Cumbria; and the hippos, elephants, giraffes,

and mighty waterfalls of the Murchison Falls Game Park, all made for a thrilling evening.

Over £400 was raised by tickets, crafts sales and donations, to be divided between the two schools linked with Shap and Orton schools.

Friends of Tarn Gill Bridge, Ravenstonedale

Our first AGM will take place on Wednesday 27th April at 7.30pm in St Oswald's Church, Ravenstonedale. The committee would love to see as many members as possible – we need a quorum of 15 in order to remain a legally constituted “small voluntary organization”!

The “Friends” have had some setbacks recently. Our first grant application, to Westmorland Limited (under their grant scheme to give small sums to aid community projects with which their staff members are involved) was rejected. Nothing daunted, we applied for another small grant from a national scheme which funds community projects, but this too was rejected. We have difficulty with such applications for funding because the County Council Highways own the bridge (but not the land on either side).

Meanwhile, Cumbria County Council's Bridge Officer has now stated that, after all, he does not agree with our surveyor's conclusion that the problems with the bridge are all in the structure above ground. He still believes that the bridge is being distorted (and will ultimately collapse) because of the action of the water in the sinkhole eroding the rock on which the upstream abutment sits. The floods in December and January have inevitably meant that CCC Highways have other priorities, and unfortunately they have now withdrawn their promise of £15,000 towards the cost of repairs. They are quite happy for the Friends to take on the repair of the bridge however...we have therefore asked them if we may proceed with investigating the upstream abutment foundations as a first step – when we have secured further funding.

Several members of the Friends attended the drop-in session in February at High Chapel, Ravenstonedale, organized by the Friends of the Lake District and the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (Ravenstonedale becomes part of the YDNP on 1 August), to discuss the proposed Heritage Lottery Fund project for the Orton Fells/Westmorland Dales area. The conservation of Tarn Gill Bridge falls into the Westmorland Dales Hidden Landscape Project and we will be supporting the bid and hoping for a successful outcome to generate some funding.

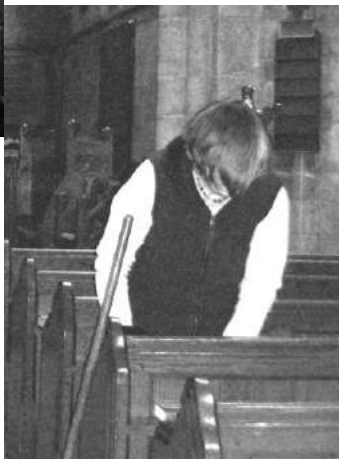

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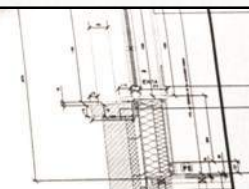
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
