Church Letter

From Fran Parkinson

Making the spiritual practical

As I write this we have just remembered the 15th anniversary of 9/11, that dreadful day in 2001 when the terrorist organisation known as Al-Qaeda flew two hijacked planes into the twin towers of the World Trade Centre in New York, killing over 3000 people.

I will probably never forget watching the breaking news as it hit our television screens, and the horror I felt as I watched the second tower fall. The news hasn't changed a great deal since then, as recent terror attacks in France have shown, and it begs the question 'how do I live authentically as a Christian in such difficult times?', or as the title suggests, 'how can I live out what I believe in practical ways?'

As a student of the Bible I began to seek some answers, and using the lectionary as my guide, have discovered that it begins, quite rightly, by living 'worshipfully'. It's probably no accident that the 1st Commandment urges us to have no other gods before the Lord. We don't worship God because he needs it (there are angels around the throne who do that night and day - Revelation 4) rather we worship God because we need it.

When we 'right-size' God, and remember that he is the Almighty, we also remember who we are in him, that is, children of the living God. This is the eternal perspective from which he asks us to view our world. When I 'turn my eyes upon Jesus' the things of earth come into sharper focus and I begin to see, as his word promises, that things over my

head are under his feet.

Living worshipfully, and knowing myself loved, also has an impact on my relationship with others. As Jesus said, '*Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength, and love your neighbour as yourself*' because the one naturally flows from the other. It's not possible to be God-centred and self-centred simultaneously!

Lastly, our worship connects us to God and with one another as a church, which is why it's good to meet regularly and declare truth through liturgy and song. In the words of the Venite, *O Come, let us worship and fall down, let's kneel before the Lord our maker. For he is the Lord, our God, and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand.* (Psalm 95)

But, of course, this is just the beginning. In the mini-series that we're studying at St Oswald's we shall be learning about living faithfully, charitably, fearlessly, thankfully (just in time for harvest!), truthfully, and finally as we move into Advent, living hopefully.

Do come and worship with us!

Notes from the Herald, October, 1916

Dull, mild, wet till final week then fine and colder.

The War was evenly balanced. On 5th October the Board of Agriculture cancelled all call-ups to farm staff until women or old men were in place to do the work instead. All droves must now carry a white light at front and rear says Government. If groups of four or less the rear light is optional.

Orton, see Farm Sales and in Tebay's piece.

Tebay Five of Thomas Stainton's ponies (Old Tebay) found on unfenced road near Orton, mid October. Fining him 10s (now £40) the Bench said "Whoever's it is, fence this road!"

Slain in the War, Private John Thistelwood, youngest son of Mr. John Snr., engine-driver of Tebay. He was quiet, sociable, a clerk in Penrith Goods Station till the War; died of wounds on 18th September. He was aged 22 and in the Northumberland Fusiliers (report and photo, Sat. 7th October). Also 2nd Lieut. Thomas A.L. Warriner, brother of Mrs. T. Walker, Church St., Tebay and son of the late Mr. George Warriner, engine driver there. He had become a pupil-teacher at Tebay Endowed School 1904-07 (was a pupil there till 1904), thence teacher training and a job in Birmingham Council Schools. A keen footballer and cricketer he was 27 and died instantly. (Report 21st October, no photo).

Orton and Tebay's Red Cross Sale of Work on Thursday, 26th was in the Tebay Parochial Institute as "Our Day" there. (Our Day was a national Red Cross event, one per district each in its own way e.g. Brough had a fancy dress parade going house to house). Auction at end. As well as handicrafts (the Work) there were lots of poultry, dogs and sheep.

Mr. A.G. Sharp, Middlegate, Penrith (where Styleline now is opposite the Museum) dentist, visits Tebay every Thursday afternoon at Mrs. Fisher's between 1 and 6p.m. "No stump too decayed for extraction" – 1s per tooth (£4 now)

Ravenstonedale Taken for the Army (the War Tribunal having rejected his appeal just before Oct. 5th) Hugh Handley who manages his father's cows, 90 in all, 27 of them dairy

cows. His father is an invalid with an 886 acre farm. There are two other brothers but he is the only person who understands the milking machine.

Slain – died of wounds received on 17th September – Private W.J.

Harvey, Newbiggin on Lune. Had a Culgaith grandfather. (Report and photo on Sat. 7th October).

Miss Annie Raine of Newbiggin on Lune, was soloist with Miss Lettie Raine of Barnard Castle, with the Teesdale Quartette Party at North Stainmore Primitive Methodist Church's 2nd annual Music Festival on Sat. 30th September. Collections totalled £20 at Ravenstonedale Congregational Church's Harvest Festival on 1st and 2nd October. Ravenstonedale's next Vicar, Rev. A.N. Claxton, was welcomed on Saturday evening at an informal social; Mr. A. Metcalfe-Gibson was in Chair, main speaker.

Mr. George Alderson of Coldbeck, lifelong of Ravenstonedale, died on 20th October aged 66 after a long,

painful illness. A very hearty man, he fared at Lythside till retirement a few years ago. He was on the Ravenstonedale Dog Show Committee and leaves a wife but no children. Ravenstonedale's "Our Day" was a concert in the Endowed School on Friday, 20th October; made £30 for the Red Cross.

A Christian Alphabet—An occasional series by Christopher Jenkin

Temptation: "Lead us not into temptation", Jesus taught his followers to pray. This often puzzles people, since surely God will not tempt us to do wrong. Of course that is true. But the word "temptation" has two meanings: (a) enticing to do something wrong; that is what not God but Satan does – one of the names given to the devil is the Tempter (*Matthew 4:3*), who even tempted Jesus to do wrong and find easier ways to live, rather than following his heavenly Father's will. We all experience this kind of temptation, and have since childhood – whether to be greedy, or dishonest, or tell lies, or be cruel; whether in minor or even trivial ways, or ways which ruin our own or other people's lives. (b) Testing: this can indeed come from God, to test our faith, or our obedience. It can come through hardship, or through having to make tough decisions. The petition, "Lead us not..." can refer to either meaning: Let me not be led astray, by the devil or other people; and if and when I am tested, let me not fail the test, but give me strength to do the right thing. In both kinds, "deliver us from evil."

Time: The concept of Time has always puzzled and fascinated people. Sci-fi writers have written stories of time travel, from H. G. Wells to Star Trek. Einstein said that time moved at different rates if a body travelled at speeds near the speed of light. How could this be? The Bible says that God created time ("In the beginning God created..."), but is himself outside of it. He "inhabits eternity" (*Isaiah 57:15*). He says, "I can tell the end from the beginning" (*Isaiah 46:10*); if he is outside of time, that makes sense. Jesus stepped out of eternity (timelessness) into time when he was conceived as a human embryo, and was born to live a fully human life, subject to the constraints of time like the rest of us. And yet at times he spoke of having witnessed the remote past – as when he says "I saw Satan fall like lightning..." (*Luke 10:18*), or that Abraham (who had lived 18 centuries before him) "rejoiced to see my day" (*John 8:56*) – and was accused of talking nonsense or being mad. He also prophesied the future – such as the destruction of Jerusalem, which happened in AD 70, or his own return in glory – which we still await. He died, rose, and ascended to heaven – which means returned to the eternal sphere; but we are told he is "the same, yesterday, today and forever." He also gives those who believe in him eternal life (*John 3:16*). The old translation used the phrase "everlasting life", but that is unsatisfactory, as it implies going on and on in time. But eternal life transcends time; believers receive that dimension of life now, even in this life, and keep it after death. But even while we are still here, limited by time, we can trust God, as the Psalmist wrote, "My times are in your hand!" (*Psalms 31:15*).

Northern Bishops' Mission 2016

Bishop James and Bishop Robert joined with the Archbishop of York and around 25 other bishops for a massive four day mission event in Lancashire in mid September organised by Blackburn Diocese.

The Crossroads Mission was a personal initiative of the Archbishop of York, The Most Revd and Rt Hon Dr John Sentamu. Our bishops were joined by Evangelism Enabler, the Rev'd Mike Talbot, and six others who were recently ordained as curates. Bishop Robert said: "As a team we looked forward to the opportunity to spend four days focused on mission work in Blackburn Diocese.

"As we sought to remind people of the relevance of the person of Jesus Christ and the salvation He offers in their

lives today, this initiative by the Archbishop was well-timed and I'm sure it was a great success.

"All the Bishops, me included, had packed schedules over the four days and I was excited about the opportunities we had to share the Gospel."

All the team members took part in a Commissioning Service at Blackburn Cathedral on

September 8 before splitting into two groups based in the deaneries of Whalley and Chorley.

The county of Cumbria will host a similar event in 2018, with ecumenical leaders from across the north joining us.

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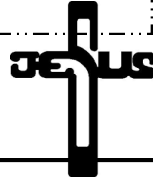
News from Orton School

Friends of Tarn Gill Bridge, Ravenstonedale



The situation has improved since our last article in The Link. Cumbria County Council Highways have confirmed that £15,000 has been reinstated in their budget provision for the bridge, but unfortunately they are not willing to use any of this money to investigate the perceived problems with the upstream (north-east) abutment of the bridge.

However, we have had some helpful involvement from the Yorkshire Dales National Park. As well as hopefully being included in the ongoing Heritage Lottery Fund bid for the Orton Fells/Westmorland Dales Hidden Landscape Project (if this bid is successful), it's possible that Tarn Gill Bridge may qualify for some funding from the YDNP budget for works in conservation areas.

It was fortunate that Gaby Rose, the YDNP Senior Listed Buildings Officer and Heritage Conservation Officer, Miles Johnson, the Senior Historic Environment Officer, Peter Stockton, Head of Sustainable Development, and Julie Martin, a member of the National Park Authority who is the current Heritage Champion were able to fit in a visit to the bridge at short notice while they were in the area. Gaby Rose agrees with the findings of our independent surveyors' report, but YDNP would only consider contributing to the cost of conserving the bridge if traditional materials are used and the repair is sensitive to the structure. She recommended that we ask a contractor experienced in repairing traditional bridges who has carried out work for YDNP in the past (and who also happens to be a qualified geologist and caver) to inspect the bridge. He brought with him a structural engineer who specializes in historic bridges and we now await their report before we discuss the way forward with YDNP. YDNP are aware that any recommendations for repairs will have to be put to CCC Highways, who own the bridge, for their agreement.

Western Dales Bus

In May the Western Dales Bus started a Friday only service from Dent to Kirkby Stephen via Sedbergh and Ravenstonedale. From Friday 30th September, this service will be expanded to operate three times in each direction. It will leave Ravenstonedale village on Fridays at 10:22 and 14:17 for Kirkby Stephen and at 12:51 and 15:10 for Sedbergh and Dent. Additionally, the bus will run via Tarn House Farm calling at the Fat Lamb at 11:47 for Kirkby Stephen and 11:06 for Sedbergh. The bus can be flagged down and will stop on request anywhere along the route. Timetabling at Kirkby Stephen Station is co-ordinated with train departures.

The Western Dales Bus started operating in 2013 in response to the progressive reduction in County Council bus subsidies. It is a charity operating on a non-profit basis and does not compete with commercial operators. Instead, its aim is to provide services where they would not otherwise be financially viable. WDB operates one bus, which was lottery funded, and receives no subsidy or other contribution from the County Council. It is operated by volunteers and all the drivers are also volunteers. The bus has only 16 seats because this is the maximum size that the law permits the volunteer drivers to drive without obtaining a professional bus driver's licence. Even so, all the drivers are trained, assessed and tested before they are allowed to drive as well as being checked by the Council and by the Disclosure and Barring Service.

Please help support this service by using it: the service can only continue if the number of users justify operating it. Concessions are accepted.

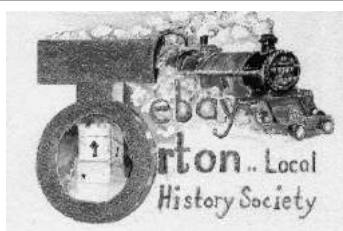
