Church Letter

From Ronnie Elliott

RESTORATION AND RENEWAL

When Jesus died and rose again, he did it for us. He paid the debt of sin on the cross and rose again in order that we might enjoy a relationship with God and receive the gift of God's Holy Spirit. That power restores us and renews us to be, reaching our potential and knowing the abundance of God's love and power in our lives.

Think about it. When we become, as individuals, the restored and renewed people of God then whole communities are restored and renewed. It's like after a heavy downpour when the sun comes out everything gleams and glistens – it's washed clean and sparkles!!

Many of us are spending hours and hours trying to restore and renew our church buildings. They are old, crumbling, damp and dirty, but were new and attractive once - and potentially could be again restored and renewed. They are gems of architecture, full of a past glory – treasures which rightly belong in our communities and without them the landscape would be changed for ever.

But – they should not be just museums and monuments of the past!! Like us, they need restoration and renewal in order to be able to be used by God and to be for his glory, as they were meant to be when they were first built.

The point of all the above is something I am passionate about – as are many others. Why were these edifices built? Was it just to be buildings for then? Shall we leave them to crumble and collapse? We might as well save ourselves all the hassle and let them fall down... Because if no one wants to worship God any more we don't need them anyway!

No! If restoration and renewal are possible let's do it! But what we do in our buildings needs restoration and renewal as well – the way we worship, the activities we share. We live **now**, not **then**! Our worship should reflect that. Change must happen, but old buildings can be restored and renewed

to house people and communities who are also renewed and restored.

So, if we really want these old buildings to be kept, let's rediscover something of the faith of the people who worked so hard to build them in the first place. For those of us who share any belief and faith in God, meeting to worship him can be a great aid to helping us grow in our faith as we seek together to learn more and share our experiences more. God our Father longs for us to renew our relationship with him and if we freely ask him back into our lives we can know a strength and a peace that maybe we'd forgotten about. May God restore us and renew us in our faith.

Stephen is currently the superintendent minister of the Farnworth and Worsley circuit in the Bolton and Rochdale district. Notes from The Herald, August, 1916

Fine, hot, dry. Haytime.

Three Orton lads were in the Battle of the Somme together in the Lonsdale Battalion; one, Pte. Fred Heslop aged 18, fell; he was farm-servant to Mr. R. Whitehead, Ellergill. The other two, Ptes. G.H. Lund and William Wilson are unscathed so far. The Lonsdales are still going under Lt. Col. Girdwood.

Ravenstonedale's Pte. James Banks, wounded on 26th July had died by 26th August. He was 22 and was living at Fell End with Mr. Dent at Huldale when he enlisted in Jan. 1916. He was sent to France in late June.

Zeppelins now fly over Eden, dropping bombs (on fields only, as yet).

Westmorland Co. Council is paying its teachers a War Bonus of £5 p.a. for six months (= £400 now). By late August the Government at last was taking note of the war-caused price rises. The national Railway Executive Committee asked passengers to bring far less luggage "as most of our porters are now in the Army".

150 years ago At the top of the 1 in 125 incline near Clifton, a goods train's four wagons came off and ran fast down it northwards, colliding at speed with a second goods train coming up derailing its engine and injuring its brakesman, Mr. Robinson of Tebay, who was taken by rail to Penrith to see Dr. Irving there.

Notes from the Herald, September, 1916

Fine, warm, sprinklings of rain. Hottest 72/73F, 7.8 hours of sun, glass 30.38ins. Draw your curtains at dusk. Several have been fined already for not doing so. All newspapers for Europe, USA or POWs must now be sent only via the Newspapers' offices (War Regulations). Don't use your headlights within six miles of the coast. (Ditto).

Orton is to have a new peal of bells. The old six are coming down and eight are going up. Faculty granted to keep the tenor in use and preserve Bells 3-5 as relics. (The Chancellor was glad to hear this as he'd have refused the faculty otherwise). The two "modern" bells will be recast and re-used. They could be rung by young boys and even by girls. The parish had raised £400 for them pre 1914 and Mr. Harvey Goodwin (Orton Hall) will give the balance - £200 or so. The Chancellor said: Mr. Whiteside, when Vicar of Shap, told me he had seen many a gallon of ale being taken up the tower by his ringers on 5 November (c 1900).

Mind your ringers don't! He also said that the "Shap Abbey Bell" was actually cast for Orton Parish in 1529-30. (*The Chancellor is the Diocese's legal officer. In 1916 it was the elderly Chancellor Prescott*).

Harvest Festival at Orton Wesleyan Church, Sunday and Monday 24/25 September. Farm Sales in Orton soon, Street Farm for Mr. T.B. Cowperthwaite's Executors, Friday 13th October: Beech View, Orton, Thursday 5th October for Mr. Joseph Raine who is leaving the district.

150 Years ago When the millstones were being raised at Orton Mill, Saturday one of them fell on Mr. R. Bland, helping; it mangled his foot. He was taken to the bonesetter at Soulby - Mr. Hutton, who set it right. Mr. Bland is now recovering well. 1916 Mr. R.W. Dent and party were shooting grouse on Orton Scar ("*Scaur*" here) in late August when a pellet struck him near the eye causing great pain. They drove him to Carlisle by motorcar where he was sent to Edinburgh by express and treated there (the pellet was extracted). His sight is now returning and he is due home on 7th September.

Tebay A lady farmer was driving a herd of young cattle through Tebay when one of them saw an open front door, went in, up the stairs and into the room at the top where an Army Reservist was asleep. She did not wake him but went down again and rejoined the herd quietly. The Cross Keys Hotel's annual Store Stock Sale is on Friday 8th at 12.30p.m. 25 cattle and 125 sheep entered so far. More

Harvest Services at Tebay Church on Saturday and Sunday, 30th September and 1st October.

Ravenstonedale Organist at Brough for Methodist Chapel's Harvest service on Sunday 17th was Miss Annie Raine from Newbiggin on Lune. The Minister preaching was born in Swaledale. Ravenstonedale Wesleyan's Harvest was Sunday and Monday, 24th and 25th September - a lot there on both days. Preacher from Blyth on Sunday, then on Monday supper and sale of produce. The Endowed School pupils' house to house collection for Dr. Barnardo's Homes raised £2.5s.0d (now = £180) Died of wounds on 25th in France, Private William John Harvey, 19, from Newbiggin on Lune; he was Newbiggin's auxiliary postman, i.e. he assisted the postmaster. He was quiet and helpful, his rounds began at 6.30a.m. and 5.10p.m. Monday to Saturday. His father, John Harvey, was Head Gardener to J.W. Fothergill Esq. J.P., Brownber. WJH enlisted in May 1915 and served first in Egypt till July 1916 (France). His parents added:

He left his home in perfect health,
He looked so young and brave.
We little thought how soon he would
Be laid in a hero's grave.
No-one knows the parting
Or what the parting cost,
But God in His great mercy
Has gained what we have lost.

A Christian Alphabet—An occasional series by Christopher Jenkin

Suffering: The most frequent objection to religious belief is this: "If there is a loving, all-powerful God, why is there so much undeserved suffering in the world?" People often raise this as if it is a new problem, only thought of by modern, educated, scientific people, but this is of course nonsense. It is the oldest problem in the world—one of the oldest books in the Bible, the Book of Job, is a kind of drama all about exactly this problem. Many, many books have been written on the subject, so this paragraph can only touch on it briefly and inadequately. We can consider several points: (1) Could God have made a world without suffering? Maybe - but he hasn't. It is an inevitable part of this material world. If I fall off a wall and am hurt, it is because of the law of gravity! (2) Much suffering - not all - is caused by human sin. If I get drunk or take drugs before driving, and then get injured in a crash, my suffering is my fault. If I pull out a knife to stab you, my sin causes your suffering. God could only prevent these incidents by taking away my free will. (3) When someone suffers illness or some other disaster, some people think it must in some way be their own fault - they are being punished for their sin. Jesus specifically denied that this is so. (4) Most of the best qualities of humanity - such as courage, or compassion - come as a result of suffering. (5) Ultimately we have to make sure we are asking the right question: not "Why do good people suffer?" but "If I suffer, how do I bear it? How do I learn from it? How can it make me a better person?" Maybe one day - in glory - we will understand the "Why" questions. In this world, let's accept that we don't, but concentrate on the "So how do I live?" questions!

ORTON WITH TEBAY FIRST RESPONDERS RECRUITING NOW!



We currently have six active First Responders in our team who attend as many calls as possible. However, we do need new members to enable us to attend more incidents.

Community First Responders are volunteers who give their time freely to help save lives in their community. Responders are everyday members of the general public who are trained in the use of Automated External Defibrillators and the treatment and control of a wide range of potentially life threatening conditions.

In cases of heart attack it has been identified that early intervention can result in a significant improvement in prognosis. First Responders provide support to the regular Ambulance Service by attending serious and life threatening 999 calls in and around the community, to provide the earliest possible intervention for patients in the first few minutes until the arrival of an Ambulance.

The Orton with Tebay Community First Responder Team was established in 2006 and currently has 6 trained volunteers covering the two parishes. Being a volunteer can be incredibly rewarding not least because Responders could save someone's life. Volunteers do not need previous First Aid experience to join their local team as full training is given.

If you would like to help in some way other than as an active Responder, there is also a need for support with administration and fundraising.

Orton School was

represented by Sally Seed, chair of the governors, teacher Katherine Simpson, and several children – and delightful model birds made by Orton School children were part of the décor of the hall. Mary Jenkin who is heading up the Orton



Churchyard Conservation Project was there.

But there were many people from further afield. There was a



team from the Yorkshire Dales National Park – both employees and volunteers – in their bottle-green tops. Civic dignitaries included Councillor Robert Redfern, Mayor of Lancaster, and his wife, Linda,

the Mayoress, with beadle Mike Reeve; Councillor Mike Tonkin, chair of Eden District Council; and Councillor Sylvia Emmott,



chair of South Lakes District Council – all these wearing chains of office.

And then there were representatives of national bodies: Margaret Read of DEFRA from London, Liz Newton, Susanna England and David Vose of Natural England; Kathryn Cook from Cardiff, on the staff of National Parks UK; and Robin, Michael and Frances Dower from Northumberland,

descendants of John Dower, the founder of National Parks. And of course there were the media – represented by the team from the BBC, from ITV Border News, and not forgetting the

After refreshments and a brief welcome, guests were invited to take part in one of the outings, by a Cumbria Classic Coach, on cycles provided by the Authority, or on foot around Orton Scar. At the same time there were activities in and around the village for children, including stream dipping, making boats from bark and making badges.

We all came back in time for a Dales roast lamb and salad

delicious lunch of Yorkshire followed by ice cream.

Speakers after lunch included John Dunning, Liz Newton of Natural England, and Carl Lis, Chair of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority; but the Guest of Honour was Lord Gardiner, the Under-Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment, Agriculture and Rural Affairs (DEFRA).



Lord Gardiner thanked all those who had planned and arranged this vibrant occasion – and he particularly praised the

amazing model birds! – and all who had worked so hard since this expansion project was first mooted in 2007. He assured the audience that he, representing the Government, was totally committed to National Parks and the Environment. This was his very first ministerial engagement, and he was delighted to be here in Orton. The two National Parks,



the Yorkshire Dales and the Lake District, were jewels in the crown of the whole National Parks movement, and he praised



those responsible for the stewardship of these areas – not just the Parks staff but especially the farmers and landowners. The Dales attract 3.6 million visitors a year, who make a huge contribution to the local economy. The stunning landscape of these areas with their wonderful flowers and trees need to be accessible, to bring great benefits to us all in terms of physical and mental wellbeing.



The Government is determined to increase opportunities for the next generation – he mentioned doubling numbers of apprenticeships, and encouraging more school visits with their opportunities for children to explore and discover wild places, and learn to respect nature.



He mentioned those in this part of the country who had suffered from devastating floods, and praised the resilience of our communities in the difficult times; but he was delighted to help us celebrate the good times, and the exceptional achievement in producing the cleanest, greenest, healthiest possible environment. We should all be very proud!

Church security advice following latest France terrorist attack

The Diocese of Carlisle has circulated to all clergy the latest security advice from the Metropolitan Police following the murder of Father Jacques Hamel in Normandy.

A statement from the National Police Chief's Council confirms there is no specific intelligence relating to attacks against the Christian community in the UK, and asks that communities remain alert but not alarmed.

Any suspicious activity should be reported via the anti-Terrorist Hotline on 0800 789321 and in an emergency dial 999. Further safety and security advice is available at the National Counter Terrorism Office website.

Meanwhile the Home Office has just launched a scheme offering funding for protective security measures for places of worship. The scheme is open for 8 weeks and closes at 5pm on 20th September. A second round of bids will open in Spring 2017.

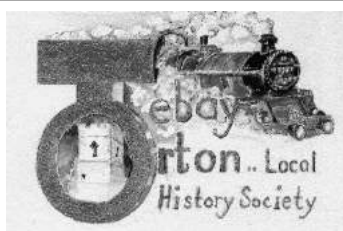
