Vicar's Letter

*From the Revd. Alun Hurd,
Vicar of High Westmorland*

HURD THE WORD

'They think it's all over – it is now!' - so said Kenneth Wolstenholme as England's fourth goal was scored by Geoff Hurst in the World Cup Final against West Germany in 1966.

I wonder if the same could be said after the General Election which has just taken place and resulted in a hung parliament led by the Conservative party. The pundits have pontificated to the 'nth degree' as to what may or may not happen in the aftermath of this historic election. No one can be certain what will happen in the light of Brexit negotiations, and in a way it reflects the uncertainty of life in general. Each day is a new day which can bring both expectation and a blank canvas as to what may happen. Most of us probably think we know what will occur as we go about our business, but as recent events have shown, the unexpected can and does happen. Many of us like to be organised and plan ahead, and the church as an institution is the place to do this with rotas, lectionaries, preaching plans, Saints' days, and of course the big events like Christmas, Easter, Ascension, Pentecost, Harvest etc.

Of course, life in general functions with a sense of order and purpose, so the unexpected can throw us off course and may be alternately disconcerting or liberating – negative or positive, or just plain confusing.

The key is to be able to assess, adapt and see what the possibilities might be. For Christians, I believe God wants us to be open to the unexpected even if we are the opposite in our personality and are more comfortable with the comfortable. This is simply because

although we are told in scripture that God is the same yesterday, today and tomorrow, that statement, and what we read elsewhere in the Bible, allows for our God to have broken into history and given the greatest gift ever to be received by humankind, Jesus Christ. God had seen that humans were in need of a more personal encounter with the Divine and so sent his Son. The coming of Jesus or the Messiah was expected by the Jewish people but missed by most of humanity at the time, and his teaching, attitudes and approach to faith and religion were unexpected and so presented a challenge.

Pentecost which we have recently celebrated in the church calendar carried on this challenge through the coming of the Holy Spirit, and was an uncertain and unexpected period in the life of what became the Early church, not least because it became 'the Church' and not a reform and fulfilment of the Jewish faith. For the church to continue to grow and develop it will have to assess, adapt and consider the possibilities.

We can speculate about but ultimately cannot know the future for ourselves either individually or nationally. However, as Christians we can believe and trust in a God who despite all that surrounds us, truly loves us and has exciting and rewarding times ahead in our Mission Communities.

Events may not be over after the General Election and post-Brexit talks to come, but England's fourth goal was enough to win the World Cup in extra time in 1966 (if you didn't know!). Therefore we live in hope for the future and the certainty of God's desire to have the best possible outcomes for us.

A VIEW FROM TEBAY

When we first looked round the house where we now live in the centre of Tebay, one of the things that most struck us was the view out over the fells down towards the Lune Gorge. Our village is connected to the rest of the world by the ever-busy M6, a picture of the constant activity of human life and the relentless busy-ness of our modern society. Yet towering above all that rumbling traffic the fells and hills stand timeless, reminding us that they have been here much, much longer than we have. Amazingly, each hour of each day the view from our kitchen window is different as the seasons, weather and light change, yet the hills remain the same - solid, firm and majestic.

We live in turbulent times. In the midst of political uncertainty, our country seems increasingly divided and many worry about the future of themselves and their children. In the aftermath of the recent terror attacks, we can find it hard to know how to respond to this apparently ever-increasing threat across the world – especially now it has come closer to home, making it seem all the more real.

Some of us are also grieving the recent and untimely loss of loved ones to the destructive power of cancer or other illnesses. We can feel powerless and anxious, but there is a verse in the Psalms which always encourages me:

I lift up my eyes to the hills – where does my help come from? My help comes from the Lord, the Maker of heaven and earth.

(Psalm 121)

These words remind me that God is above and beyond all the turbulence of our world, just as the fells stand above and beyond the noise and busy-ness of the motorway. He is timeless and unchanging, even if our view of him changes, or we can't seem to see

him at all. And yet – the incredible message of the Bible is that this God has also come among us, into the turbulence and confusion, the hurt and the anger, and has been a victim of the worst that humanity can throw at us. He's ready to walk with each one of us, gently reminding us of his constant presence – if we will only slow down and take the time to listen to his voice.

Perhaps we can do that by meditating on the hills, as we walk them or look out at them from our homes.

Perhaps we can do that by coming together as a community, in our various village events and groups.

And maybe we can connect with God through prayer, both as individuals in our own way, and together with others in our community in new and creative ways, as we work to build a better world where God's love rules.

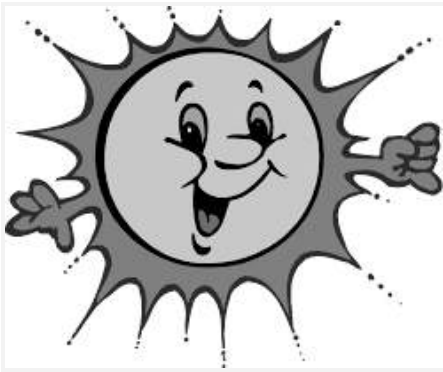

Notes from the Herald, July 1917

Fine, warm, very dry. One wet day on 25th. In the last 100 weeks Orton School has collected 7362 eggs (in 2017 money, July, £1.50 each) for wounded soldiers. They are sent weekly to W. Fleming's, Shap shop (grocer). One of the wounded sent the school a thank you letter – "I have just had one of your eggs for breakfast. It was lovely". Send in your sphagnum moss – the Field hospitals at the Front use it for stopping wounds bleeding. Tom Holmes, Orton, sent a Kirkby Stephen man a lurcher to be sent to a client as part of a mail order business; prepaid but alas no dogs sent out. Culprit, W.J. Bainbridge, 51, labourer, jailed for three years plus hard labour. (Is this the ex-Ravenstonedale bootmaker again?)

Missing, probably slain, Private Arthur Cowperthwaite, Border Regiment. Pte W.J. Hulley, fellow Ortonian there, has sought out his details and written to his sister at Holes Farm. Robert Cowperthwaite, brother, is in Sheffield Military Hospital after shrapnel wounds in leg.

Tebay – Missing since 9th April but news just come to Tebay in first week of July, Pte. George Ward, Canadian Expeditionary Force, only son of Mr. and Mrs. John Ward, ex Tebay, now Alberta. Mr. W.H. Myers, born in Tebay, is now the organist at Alexandria Church near Dumbarton. On Sunday afternoon, 22nd, he gave an organ recital in Tebay Church for the Tebay War Fund. Mrs. T. Walker (Tebay) sang two solos.

Mr. G.H. Blackett, butcher's son, butcher and farmer by turns fell on hard times in April and is now bankrupt, owes £118. His father died in 1901. GHB has a wife and one child and spends 25 to 30 shillings a week in housekeeping.

Greenholme's water is from its beck. The RDC thinks it could put in mains water for Greenholme. To inquire further.

Ravenstonedale Endowed School's Infants teacher, Miss H. Butt, is leaving after fifteen years there. A Presentation to her of £8 collected (would now be £640). She's changing her career – has joined the staff of the Bank of Liverpool's Keswick branch. Slain in France on 1st June, Pte. Tom Bradberry of Stennerskeugh, who worked for Mr Joseph Robertson, joiner, Orton, till enlisting.

The plague of caterpillars (antler moth) has now reached Saddleback and the Caldbeck Fells. Last came in 1885. It came hither via Mallerstang.

150 years ago Died at Ravenstonedale on 11th July, 1867, Ellen, daughter of William Potter, Parish Clerk. She was 26.

Biblical Names

An occasional series by Christopher Jenkin

Names go in fashions, and in recent years parents have started to call their children by names which are found in the Bible – though they are not always aware of that, nor of who the Bible character was.

Abel: One of the sons of Adam and Eve (*Genesis 4*). His elder brother was Cain; both brothers made offerings to God, but whereas Abel – described as one who kept flocks – offered the best he had, Cain apparently was more casual in his offering, and was rebuked by God. He was furious, and in his anger and jealousy he killed his brother. Adam had been told that death would result from stealing the forbidden fruit; the first recorded death in the Bible was a murder.

Abraham: One of the greatest patriarchs in the Old Testament story; his saga is spread over fourteen chapters of the Book of Genesis. He came from the city of Ur, in modern Iraq, a city which archaeologists have found to have had a polytheistic culture, with over 400 different gods; and somehow from that pagan background Abraham came to believe in a single God of all the earth. His name originally was Abram, which means "Exalted father", but when God's promise of a huge posterity was repeated to him, his name was changed to reflect this: Abraham means "Father of multitudes". His faith in that God went through stormy times, and, great man though he was, he made serious mistakes, just like the rest of us. But he had been promised by God that even in extreme old age he would have a son who would start a dynasty through which all the world would be blessed. His faith in that promise, even when it seemed quite impossible of fulfilment, is given to all believers as a marvellous example. Abraham is revered by three great world religions – Judaism, Islam and Christianity.

*Jeremy Godwin commented on the previous article in the May issue of **The Link** about **Aaron**:-*

His name's meaning is omitted; in Dr. Robert Young's Concordance (c.1885), "Aaron" is said to mean "Enlightenment" which he was, through Moses his brother's conversations with God. Young also gives his ancestry. Aaron was great-great-grandson of Jacob and was the middle child of his parents whose eldest was Miriam, and youngest was Moses. Miriam means "broad and strong"; she became the prophetess. But Miriam is not the Hebrew version of "Mary" as some assert. "Mary" is the Hebrew word for "bitter".

I am currently researching the history of our pubs for a talk I will give to the Ravenstonedale Parish History Group in January 2018. Orton Churchyard Conservation Project

Tree Felling: The felling of the Leylandii trees is now completed. The stumps have been ground up, so there are masses of wood chippings down the right side and at the far end of the churchyard. These are FREE to anyone who wants them! Please go and help yourself any time, sooner rather than later.

Bat Walk: On Wednesday 30th August a Bat Walk has been arranged with Paul Arkle whose detailed Bat Survey revealed no less than four, possibly five, different species of bats in the church or churchyard: Soprano Pipistrelle, Common Pipistrelle, Noctule Bat, and Brown Long Eared Bat, and *possibly* Myotis. Anyone of any age is welcome to come on the Bat Walk - come 15 minutes before sunset (8 p.m.) to the church door.



Headstone Repairs: Work is being carried out to repair and re-erect some damaged or fallen headstones - a number of which have been in a bad way for years; others were damaged more recently. Here is Kevin Bateman and his colleague from Parkin & Jackson working in our churchyard:



Headstone History: Heather Ballantyne has been working for many, many hours, to compile as complete a list as possible of all the headstones in our churchyard, with all the names and inscriptions. Every



memorial, inside and outside the church, has been photographed. She has used the earlier research of Edward Bellasis in 1888, and that of Leslie Smith who did extensive studies in 1977. Some of the inscriptions recorded then are now illegible through weathering, so these earlier records are vital. Heather's work is being put into a 300-

page book, which is shortly to be sent for printing. A copy of this will be available for inspection in church, especially for those who want to find an ancestor's grave. (Anyone wanting a personal copy should contact me, please.)

It should be noted that responsibility for the upkeep of graves lies with the family, not the church. Any donations towards the expensive work on the headstones would be very welcome.

What next? The next thing is to tidy up in general; a work party will be mustered before long! Please contact me if you would like to volunteer to help on such a work party.

Then we must decide on what new trees - native hardwoods - are to be planted, and where they should go. We have been given some donations towards new trees, and the Hayes Garden Centre have promised us a discount.

We also must decide on the siting of the squirrel feeder, the hedgehog house, and the two bat houses (*right*) we have been given and which are still waiting in our conservatory!

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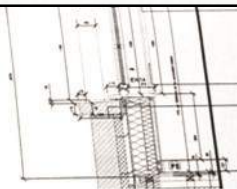
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
