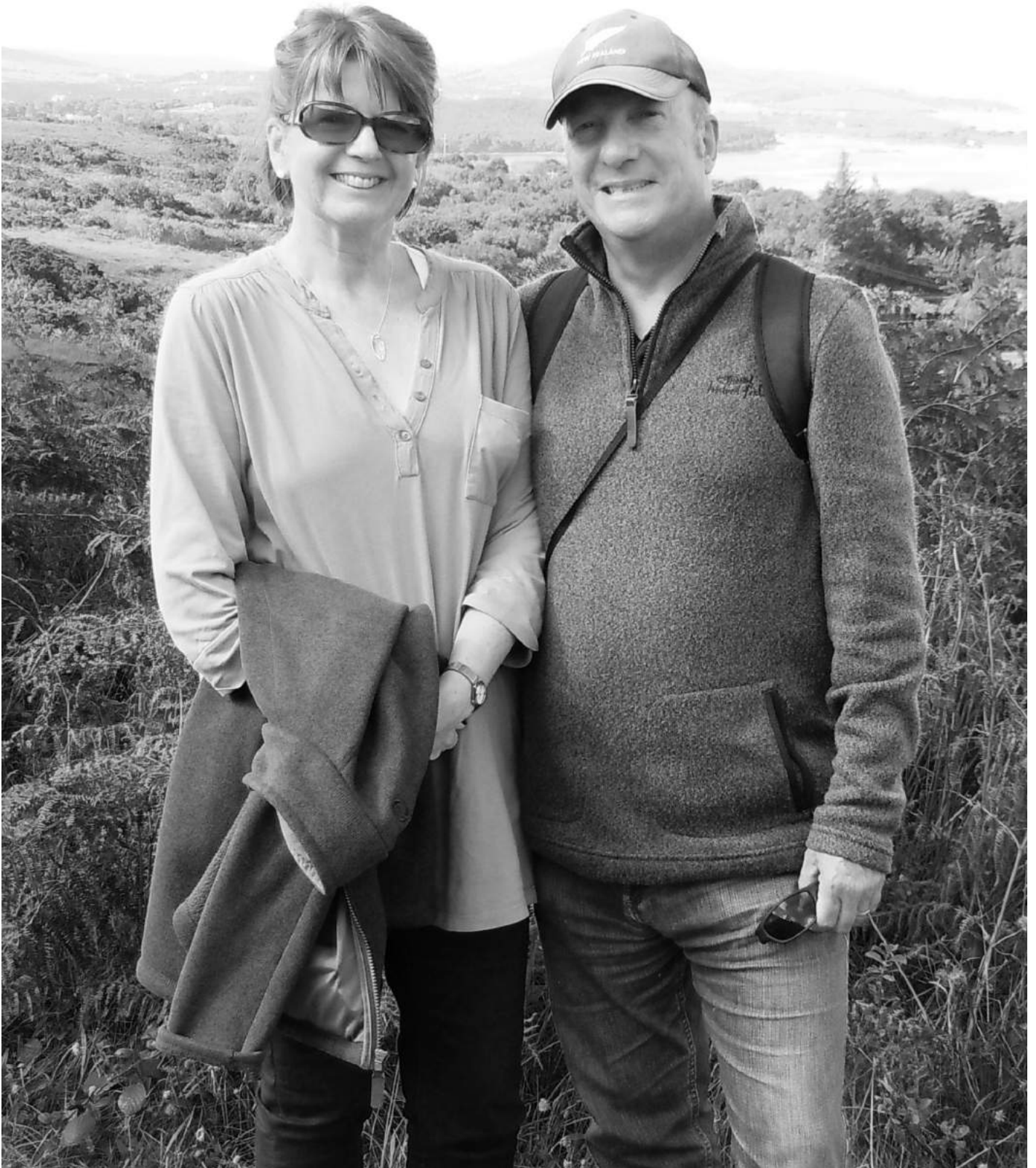

Church Letter

*From the Revd. Alun Hurd,
Vicar-Designate for High Westmorland Churches*

Over the last few years, churches across Cumbria of all denominations have been talking, praying and planning together. The result is **God for All**. Our aim is this:

By 2020 every person in Cumbria of all ages and backgrounds will have had an opportunity to discover more of God and God’s purpose for their lives.

Arising out of this vision is:-



What is Moving Mountains?

Moving Mountains (see *Mark 11:23*) is an opportunity for churches to work together across Cumbria in mission.

From **8th – 11th March 2018** we will be joined by teams led by bishops and leaders of other churches from across the north of England, drawn together by the Archbishop of York, Dr John Sentamu. We anticipate having about 30-35 such teams visiting the county, composed of a mix of lay people, youth workers, ordinands and clergy.

They are not coming to do mission. They are coming to help, encourage and support **local** churches planning and doing **local** mission. The events and style of the mission are decided

at local church and area level, with the visiting mission team supporting what has been decided by churches.

Launch Events

In February this year there were five Launch Events across the county, and members sent by the churches in our area attended the Launch Event in Penrith on 16th February.

There we learned more about what is envisaged, and heard stories of how very different people can be helped to move forward in their journey of faith.

Part of this is to encourage those who are already believers to tell their stories; stories are powerful ways of sharing our faith. ***WATCH THIS SPACE!***

A Christian Alphabet—An occasional series by Christopher Jenkin

Word: The Word of God is what God says. The Bible presents to us a God who speaks. In the Old Testament, hundreds of times we are told “The word of the Lord came to” someone. The very first mention of God speaking is in the Creation story in Genesis chapter 1, where many times it says, “And God said...” And there was a physical result. “And God said, ‘Let there be light!’ and there was light.” This is summed up in Psalm 33:6: “By the word of the LORD the heavens were made, their starry host by the breath of his mouth.” But in the New Testament, we find that when God really wants to speak to his world, he sends a person, his eternal Son; and John’s Gospel starts with the great and mysterious sentence, “In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.” And a few verses further on, he writes, “The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory!” That’s who Jesus was – the way, above all other ways, in which God speaks to us. The New Testament often refers to the Scriptures as “the word of God” – the written word; but that written word points us to the living Word, Jesus.

World: “The world” is Scripture has several shades of meaning. First it means the created order; not just this planet, but the whole universe. Obviously we have a far clearer understanding today of how vast and complex that universe is; but the Greek word “Cosmos”, usually translated “world”, has a root meaning orderly, and even beautiful – as in our word “cosmetic”. It implies that this astonishing universe of billions of galaxies is ordered by God, and arouses in scientists and observers a reaction of wonder and admiration. The cosmologist who is a Christian believer (yes, there are some!) is prompted to exclaim, “How wonderful are your works, Lord God Almighty!” Secondly “world” means the world of humanity. “God so loved the world that he gave his only Son.” (*John 3:16*) It was not the physical planet that prompted this loving gift from God, but the people who live on it. When Jesus was tempted by Satan’s promise to give him “all the kingdoms of the world” if Jesus would only bow down to him (*Matthew 4:8,9*) it was not the physical or geographical territories but the people who live there being referred to. But a third meaning of “world” is of the disordered, rebellious world, in the grip of the evil one; the phrase “this world” is often used of all those forces which oppose God, or the temptations which draw us away from him, to rebel against him, and desire created things rather than the creator. Thus “Do not love the world!” writes John (*1 John 2:15*). He goes on, “For everything in the world – the cravings of sinful humanity, the lust of his eyes and the boasting of what he has and does – comes not from the Father but from the world. The world and its desires pass away; but the person who does the will of God lives for ever.” (*1 John 2.16,17*)

It's good to hear that David Trotter is getting nearer home and is in Penrith Hospital now. We send our good wishes to him and to his family.

I have been busy travelling down to the Royal Preston Hospital to visit my good friend who was flooded out in Kendal. She had a fall at home and broke her neck. She already has serious health problems and this is a terrible thing to happen to a healthy person, never mind someone older and struggling with health problems. She has been too ill for surgery but it is on the cards for this week if she picks up enough to have it. No wonder she is asking "why?". There are no easy answers to this question. The only part answer is that God is with us in it whatever any of us have to face.

It's Valentine's Day tomorrow. Like many others I won't be getting any flowers or cards or nice meals out. Some of us have "loved and lost", or not had the fortune to have a partner or they have passed on. I wish all those in happy relationships, marriages, and civil partnerships a happy day tomorrow.

I am off to Leeds for £9 return with part of my journey on the Tornado steam train. That should be fun and in celebration of the Carlisle/Settle line fully opening where the floods caused so much damage. You can go on the

Flying Scotsman on 31st March but that will be £220. It will be a £1.99 voucher at McDonalds and a flask of coffee for me, not being one of the rich pensioners who are in the news at the moment.

On the subject of dealing with debt we are very fortunate now to have branches of CAP – Christians against Poverty – based in Penrith and Kendal. I can recommend them and their telephone number is 0800 328 0006 or look them up on their website. It helps to have some experts who can help us in practical ways to become debt free and no longer to have all the anxiety and worry that shortage of and owing money causes.

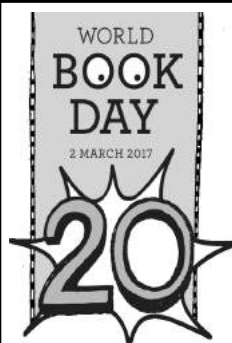

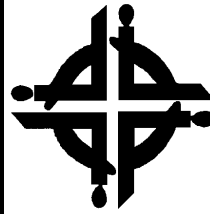

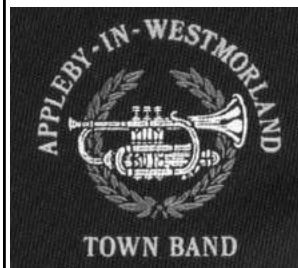

A Ground-breaking Service at All Saints' Church

Some months ago Carlisle Diocese circulated a document entitled "Yes You Can!", about what churches in Cumbria can do ecumenically.

It includes: *"You can lead services in each other's churches, including presiding at Holy Communion. Visiting Clergy from a different (covenant partner) church who is licensed to lead worship can also lead in your church. They are permitted to lead worship according to the rites and traditions of the host church (i.e. using your own traditions, service books, etc.) If your services are recorded in a register, then this service should be described as one from their tradition, even though it seemed like one of yours!"*

So on Sunday 12th February the Revd. Philip Rigby, a retired Methodist minister who lives in Orton, presided at the Holy Communion Service in All Saints' Church, using the form in Book of Common Prayer.

This is the first time in this area that such a thing has happened. With the growing cooperation between the different Christian denominations we are sure - and hope - that it will not be the last. Indeed we expect such sharing of worship to become more common in our churches.

We were delighted to welcome our brother in Christ to lead our worship.

Woodland grants available now

For landowners considering planting new woodlands in the Yorkshire Dales National Park, now is the perfect time to apply to the

Forestry Commission. The window to apply for grants has recently opened and closes on 1st March. This will be the only application window this year.

Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA) Senior Trees & Woodland Officer, Geoff Garrett said: "We are looking for landowners to come forward with proposals for new woodland so we can help them make an application to the Forestry Commission on time, before 1st March.

"At the moment there is a unique opportunity to combine the grants available from the Forestry Commission, the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust and ourselves at the National Park Authority, to effectively get all of the costs covered. Annual maintenance grants are also available for 10 years after planting and there are also opportunities to gain carbon credits on the new planting.

"The National Park Authority Trees and Woodland Team will be pleased to do the work required, free of charge, to put the applications together and find the necessary contractors.

"We are very keen that landowners take maximum possible advantage of the financial support available to create new woodland in the National Park. Part of the shared vision of the National Park Management Plan is to make the Park resilient and responsive to the impacts of climate change and as part of that we have a goal to support farmers and landowners to create at least 400 hectares of new native woodland by 2020. New woodland will strengthen wildlife habitat networks, increase carbon storage and help to reduce flooding. And woodland looks great too, adding to the scenic beauty of the Park."

Richard Pow, Forestry Commission Partnerships and Expertise Manager, said: "We warmly welcome the work of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority in helping and encouraging farmers and landowners to create new woodlands in the National Park. These will help to deliver against the Government's target of planting 11 million trees this parliament."

Friends of Tarn Gill Bridge, Ravenstonedale

The Friends have now received a verbal report on the condition of the bridge and the causes of its deterioration from Pete Roe, a caving expert who also repairs traditional stone structures. He has recommended that a dye test be undertaken, using the methodology of the British Cavers Research Association, to show where the water goes when it disappears down the swallowhole upstream of the bridge.

We hope this will confirm Pete's view that the water has nothing to do with the problem with the bridge abutment – i.e. the foundations are not being eroded by the water disappearing down the swallowhole. We hope to get this test done, subject to the necessary permissions, as soon as the water level in the beck drops sufficiently in the spring. Pete welcomes observers during such tests, and we are pleased that the Yorkshire Dales National Park will be sending their Community Heritage Officer to photograph the event. We will let the Friends know by email when the test will be, and we hope as many folk as possible will come. We have also invited Cumbria Highways to observe the test, but at the time of writing have not had a reply.

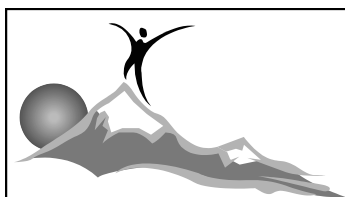

The Reorganisation of our Parishes

From 1st December 2016 and complying with the 'Mission and Pastoral Measure 2011' the Right Reverend James Newcome, Bishop of Carlisle, has consented to the following measures:

1. The parish of Orton and the parish of Tebay to be united to create a new parish named 'The Parish of Orton with Tebay'.
All Saints' Church, Orton and St James' Church, Tebay are both parish churches of the new parish.
2. The benefice of Orton and Tebay with Ravenstonedale and Newbiggin-on-Lune, the parish of Shap with Swindale and the parish of Bampton with Mardale in the diocese of Carlisle to be united to create a new benefice named 'The Benefice of High Westmorland'.
3. The Vicarage, Shap, to be the residence of the new incumbent.
The Vicarage, Orton to be transferred to the Carlisle Diocesan Board of Finance.

As a direct result of this Orton and Tebay Parochial Church Councils have merged to form one joint PCC.

RAVENSTONEDALE PARISH HISTORY GROUP

At a well-attended meeting in January Val Fermer presented her annual talk on the migration of various families and individuals from Ravenstonedale to the first industrial city of Manchester between the 1820's and the early 1900's. The talk was researched using the History Group's Archives, Census Returns, various web-sites, Manchester Library and personal contact with descendants of some of the 'migrants'.

The majority of migrants had prospered and in many cases went on to establish their own businesses. Some became sufficiently wealthy to return to their county of birth and purchase property. Some were less fortunate and others went from Manchester to the other migrant destinations of New Zealand, Canada and Australia.

The Udale family were local Millers in Ravenstonedale. In the 1830's five Udale sisters left Ravenstonedale for Manchester. Three married; two ran a confectionery shop for a number of years. In the days before cars or even railway connections to Manchester, the journey for the sisters will have been arduous, so there must have been a real compulsion for the sisters to migrate to a new life in the City.

The Airey family was a story of great success in business. Three Airey brothers, Thomas, John and William and two of their sisters were at various times in Manchester in the 1800's. The brothers became successful business men, running their own companies, ranging from flag merchants to canal boat operators, and owning warehouses near the Rochdale Canal in central Manchester. Thomas owned a range of property in Chorlton (Manchester). When he died in 1854, in his last home at the Low Wood Hotel, Windermere, his estate, in today's terms, was worth around £500,000. He left £150 (now £8,000) to set up a charity for the relief of the poor in the parish.

Unlike the Aireys, George Lancelot Blackett did not prosper. Before he arrived in Manchester prior to 1901, aged 20, he worked with his father who was the Ravenstonedale butcher. He worked for a while at a drapery shop in Manchester and then travelled to New Zealand. Val had unearthed a newspaper report that showed he had committed suicide by cutting his own throat with a razor and had left a note saying 'goodbye - I'm one of the rotters'!

John Bousfield left Ravenstonedale for Manchester prior to 1863. He initially worked on the railways, and then lived and worked in the same pub for at least 50 years. His son, John Thomas, had a distinguished academic career. He attended Bonn University and became the Very Reverend John Thomas Bousfield. Another publican, Thomas Murthwaite, ran a pub in the Ancoats area of Manchester, then moved to Hulme and eventually to Fleetwood. Val had sourced photos of the various pubs.

George Leonard Buck originated in Newbiggin and was in Manchester by 1911. He emigrated to Canada in 1921 along with his mother and brothers and sisters. Val had found him in records as living in Verdun, Montreal in 1962, working in public relations. There were photos of the Buck family in the Ravenstonedale archives, donated by a descendant of one of George's brothers.

James Fawcett was born in Ravenstonedale in 1817, the son of a tailor. By 1861 he was a tailor in Manchester. In 1863 he emigrated to Melbourne with his wife and family, still working as a tailor, though curiously in his emigration papers he described himself as a 'labourer'. The final slide was a photo of his son and family enjoying a picnic in their Australian garden in the late 1920's which Val had obtained from the great-great-granddaughter of James Fawcett.

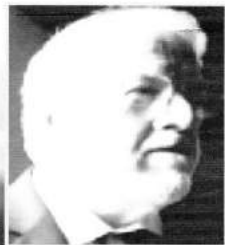

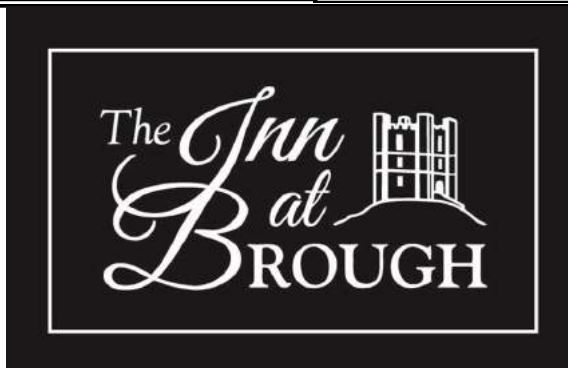
