HURD THE WORD

From the Revd. Alun Hurd

The Women's Football World Cup, the One Day International Cricket World Cup followed by the Ashes, the US Open Golf Tournament, Wimbledon, the Formula One Grand Prix motor racing, the Tour de France cycling, even the Stanley Cup in Hockey. All sports that have taken, are taking or will be taking place during this summer season and perhaps many others too.

For a sports fan possibly absolute paradise, for the rest possibly misery or indifference and certainly an excuse to go out or find something else to do for a while....

Well, I'm not going to blab on about any of the above in particular, but I'd like to consider the fact that all of the above are competitive and will mean that someone or a team will win the event or competition in question. As many of you will know, it is great if you win but not so good if you lose. Yes, there is always another day, another year, another final or competition for many of those taking part - but not always, and there may only be that one opportunity.

Life can also seem a bit like that too sometimes, and given that there are many billions of humans on this planet, the chances and opportunities may be limited for each one of us.

Paul the apostle makes the point in 1 Corinthians 9: 24-25:

*'In a race all the runners run,
but only one gets the prize. Run
in such a way as to get the prize*

*..... They do it to get a crown
that will not last; but we do it to
get a crown that will last for
ever.'*

The gift or prize that God offers in the human race is for all to receive, and the only condition of that prize is to do our best to be a disciple (learner) and follow Jesus as our example and way of living, and to love one another. This is not easy to do, but like any athlete or sports person some preparation is required to get the body in shape, to 'run with perseverance the race marked out for us' (Hebrews 12: 1). We can do the same spiritually, giving ourselves time and commitment to achieve what God wants for and from us, 'fixing our eyes on Jesus, the one who began our faith ...' (Hebrews 12:2).

The reward is great, as Paul writes 'the (victors') crown lasts for ever' and is a source of joy, peace and comfort. It leads to eternal life, looks beyond the here and now and is the fulfilment of God's love. It is a prize that you and I can grasp, and I invite you all to share that prize with me.

Whatever the ups and down of whichever team or sports person you follow, in Jesus we are on to a winner now and for ever.

God bless you all, and maybe I'll see you at the Tebay & Orton Families Together Sports Day on the 7th July.

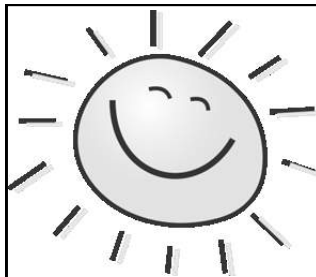

ORTON PARISH COUNCIL

The Annual General Meeting of Orton Parish Council took place on 20th May and was well attended by 50 or so parishioners. Mr. John Dunning opened the meeting and spoke about the changing nature of farming and how such change impacts upon the local landscape. He introduced Mr. David Evans who talked about the work of the Westmorland Dales Landscape Partnership Scheme and how this might affect the village and its surrounding hamlets. The Scheme will run for four years and has funding of £3.45 million. He mentioned that the Partnership was opening an office in Tebay where work would begin on the various projects including cultural heritage projects; projects concerned with sustainable farming; improving rights of way and access and supporting the tourism industry.

Mr. Kyle Blue (chairman) mentioned the various activities of the Parish Council over the year including the provision of two additional defibrillators, work to maintain and upgrade the children’s play area and further work to improve the community parkland. The Parish Council had taken over the footway lights from Eden District Council during the year, and would continue to maintain the public toilets. He thanked the volunteers who assisted with the annual village litter pick and also the Speedwatch volunteers who have worked hard to reduce the speed of traffic through the village.

The July meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Monday 15th July at The Market Hall at 7.30pm.

Peace was signed with Germany and celebrated nationally this month unless (as at Orton) haymaking came first. Orton's do will be in August.

Bybeck Farm, 115 acres, sold for £3,000 to Orton Hall's owner. 3. Scarside, Orton, house and 30 acres sold to Mr. George Little its tenant for £810 (his rent is £28 p.a.) 4. House and shop in Church St., Tebay.

Townhead Farm, Tebay. One son, a Sgt. Major, was slain in the Dardanelles, 1915. (Obituary, 26th July).

Tebay's Mr. S. Jackson made the Brough Primitive Methodist Circuit's presentation to its minister, the Rev. F.A. Young, at Kirkby Stephen. He moves to Goole Circuit now, has been at Kirkby Stephen for seven years. Four speakers, no 3 being Mr. W. Bainbridge, Newbiggin-on-Lune. The shop and house in Church St., Tebay (rent £20 p.a.) was sold by auction on 24th to Tebay Co-op for £340. Longdale School is celebrating the Peace on the national weekend this month.

Ravenstonedale's oldest inhabitant, Mrs. Mary Handley, Bridge House, died aged 94 after being ill for four years. She died on 2nd July there. Her late husband, Mr. Isaac Handley of Northwaite, died over 55 years ago trying to save a neighbour who had fallen into the river (with horse and cart) at Northwaite Bridge. Since then she lived in Graham Street, Penrith for several years, then moved to Darlington, then moved back to Ravenstonedale. (Obituary and photo of her, 5th July, page 5). She has one daughter, now in Darlington. Mary's son, Thomas of Park House, predeceased her.
